Answering your letter of March 9th regarding William and Anna Joel, we wish you would give us more facts so that when we ask for information, we will know why we want it. Is Mrs. Joel being held at the border? Do you want to verify Mr. Joel's legal arrival or whether he became an American citizen and whether he received his citizenship papers, or do you want to verify Mrs. Joel's arrival?

Anyway, Ellis Island tells us that if you are trying to get this information in order to establish legal residence, you must ask the immigration officials of El Paso to write to Ellis Island to secure it. It will not be given to any agency directly. We want to be of service, but please give us more information in the future in order to save time.
