We are anxious to know what results you have had with reference to this party as we are anxious to assist these boys in getting a quota number for their brother who they wish to send to school in the U.S.-

This boy has had 4 years of college work, but due to religious and racial prejudice he seems to be unable to continue with his studies along medical science.

It is true that the boys will get a students visa for their brother, since five of the brothers are in the ULS. four of who are loyal American citizens.

This young man would be an asset as a future American citizen and if you could get him a permit to enter the U.S. his brothers would be very happy.

What can you do to help us in getting this quota number? Kindy give this matter your earliest possible co-operation and believe us to be.

Dear Friends:-

We are advised by the H I A S that you are their correspondent in Czecho-Slovakia, and we are writing you at this time with reference to Maurice Blaugrund, who is a resident of Mukacova, and who will no doubt call on you shortly after you receive this letter.

It is our desire to secure a quota number for this young man, to enable him to migrate into the United States, and we are trying to have him admitted especially that he can finish his educational studies here among his family and friends, and for this reason we deem it necessary and would suggest that he secure from the institution where he attended, a certificate as to his progress and qualifications, so that he can confirm the statements made in your appeal to the proper official.

His brothers here advise us that he has had four years of college work in Prague, and they all want him to come here, to continue his medical studies, but reather than for him to secure a students vise, they want him to stay here permanently. The brothers are all financialy able to and will guarantee the United States Government, that this young man will not become a public charge, should he be allowed to onter the United States. Four of the five brothers here are Citizens of the United States.

He will present some documents to you, sent him by his brothers, also letters of reference, which we would ask that you use to your best advantage.

Also attached herewith are two affidavits, sworn to and signed by very prominent citizens of this Caty, which we trust will convince the proper official to whom you will refer this matter, that the young man Maurice Blaugrund comes well reccomended.
