Referring to your letters of October 7th and 12th, our replies thereto and our telephone conversation yesterday, it gives me pleasure to advise you that our Antwerp office cabled us that a party of passengers by the name of Kaplan, consisting of one adult and five children, sailed from Antwerp on the steamer VADERLAND on January 28, 1906 in Third Class.

We have verified this fact from our passenger list on file here and find that the names given were as follows:

Dear Mrs. Whitman; We are seeking verification of legal entry into the U.S. of Benj. Myer Kaplan or Myer Baruch or Maier Boris, who claims to have arrived at Ellis Island New York in the winter of 1904-05 enroute to his uncle Barnett Beurman 19 Laconia St., Boston Mass.

He claims that he attended night school at the Franklin School on Waltham Street near Shamut Ave. and Tremont Street for two winters shortly after his arrival. He also, claims to have been about 16 years of age.

Affidavits from his uncle gives the dates of his residence with him as 1908 to 1918 which is very conflicting. We are unable to get any record from Ellis Island and therefore ama am appealing to you to get all possible data on this case. Please rush your answer as Mr. Kaplan is detained here by Immigration Authorities for a clearance of his case. You may also inform his relative that said Mr. Kaplan is stranded financially and he must have funds to live and fight his case.
