May we ask you to cooperate in the following case?

Mr. Alfred Oppenheimer, a German refugee who has been in the U.S. on a visit for the last year and a half is anxious to change his status and get legal admission to this country. He is planning to go to Mexico as soon as the necessary documents are procured. His uncle, Mr. Leo Lehman, who is a very active citizen in civic and communal affairs in the city, is the president of one of the largest furniture firms in Pittsburgh. Consequently, he is able to prepare affidavits which will carry sufficient weight with the American consul.

Miss Cecilia Razovsky advised us to communicate with you and ask you to handle the case. Would you be kind enough to give us definite instructions and tell us how to proceed in this case after all the necessary documents have been executed?

Dear Miss Saul: -

We will be glad to advise the young man if he comes to El Paso with the necessary documents. You are, I presume, familiar with the requirements. All documents must be in duplicate and the German in duplicate translation. The affidavits from two relatives, if possible, should be accompanied by documentary evidence such as Dun & Bradstreet report, photostat of income tax report, letter of credit from the bank. The young man should also have a banking account of not less than \$2,000.00, if possible.

Upon his arrival in El Paso, advise him to stop at the Hilton Hotel and call Main-8579 (my telephone number) and I will be glad to assist him.
