unavoidable delay is due
to the unsettled condition
at this border. I have the
\$8⁰⁰ of the \$10⁰⁰ you left
with me and I will need
\$16⁰⁰ to cover visa and
other incidental expenses.
Kindly forward that

We advise that you
make application for
your sisters return into
the U. S. on Form 575.
We are quite sure that
you will be advised against
it but there is nothing
like making an attempt
that may go thru. File
this application with the
Bureau of Immigration
in Washington. Application
must be made out by
your father, signed by
2 witnesses & sworn
to before a Notary Public.
