I am a young German, 23 years old, born in Berlin, but my father and my grandfather were both citizens of the United States of America.

I am just applying for my immigration visa here in Mexico City at the American Consulate and I have 4 affidavits of support that I would never become a public charge in the United States.

In spite of so much proof the American Consul is still not convinced that I would not become a public charge. I am now in Mexico City already 2 months and my relatives in the States are very anxious to have me there to remain and live with them.

As I have no help here in Mexico City and I don't know anybody I am asking you for the kindness to give me a letter of introduction to some people here in Mexico City who will help me to get my

Referring to the enclosed copy of a letter received from Horst Harry Fridberg, we surmise that you have information in your files, and will appreciate your sending them to me.

It is a mistake sending German Refugees to Mexico City, because the Consul General is anti-alien, and being so far from this border, it makes it difficult for us to assist the applicant.

We have no Fraternal connections in Mexico City, and cannot see any way to assist this boy out of his difficulties, and because he has applied to the Consul in that City and been refused, he will be unable to make application elsewhere. However, with a better understanding of the case, I will try to help him.

The above mentioned young man arrived in the United States on Merch 19, 1936 on a visitor's visa. Heris traveling on a German passport which was issued in Berlin on May 17,1933 and valid until May 17,1938.

He came to our office requesting advice and assistance in changing his status from that of a visitor to that of a permanent resident in the United States. He advised that he has a great uncle, Edward Ucko, who resides in New York City and who is very willing to make out an affidavit of support. In addition, Mr. Ucko is well acquainted with a man in Chicago who has personal contact with the American Consul in Mexico.

Mr. Fridberg was very certain of the fact that he could change his status in Mexico because the friend of his uncle was writing a personal letter to the American Consul in Mexico, also to the American Ambassador in Mexico. Mr. Fridberg left for Mexico in the middle of May. After some difficulty he has now received his regular quota visa.

Now Mr. Fridberg expects to have various difficulties entering the United States as he has told the American Consul that he possessabout \$700.00. This, he is unable to prove. His relatives here have been supporting the boy for a very long period of time and at the present time feels totally unable to raise the money.

We are wondering whether you could contact our representative at or near the border between Mexico and the United States, to a seist Mr. Fridberg in getting across to the United States. He is planning to travel from Mexico City to New York by bus. He is now residing at "El Mayab" Paso De La Reforma No. 265, Mexico, D. F.

We would appreciate it very much if you would be able to assist the young man. Mr. Fridberg is 23 years of age. He is in a nervous state due to the numerous difficulties which he has encountered.

I have your letter of July 6th and hasten to advise you that this young man has received his visa, according to the latest information.

Furthermore, we must tell you that the boy came to our office with his uncle. Their plans had already been ade. Although we note every effort to dissuade them from going to Mexico, they insisted that they have their as about and had personal contacts at the office of the American Consulate and that they what they were doing. Therefore there was nothing left for us to but to give them the best advice under the circumstances; also to give them your name and that of Mrs. Mayer, so that if they got into any difficulties they could consult you and get advice more quickly than if they mited to get advice from New York. We have made it a rule not to send anybody into Mexico without first consulting with El Paso about the matter.

In this particular case about which you have written us, we understand the young fellow is afraid he will have difficulties about getting back into the United States because the \$700 mich he told the American Consul he possessed, is not with him and he has no way of showing that money at the border. Therefore, it would be elpful if you would arrange to meet him at Juarez and help him through his examination at the border. He is coming through by bus, we understand. A telegram to this effect is being set to you today. We do not know
