Dear Mrs. Weinshenk:-

#### Re: George Freschel.

It affords me pleasure to inform you that Mr. Froschel received his Austrian quota number and was legally admitted to the United States today.

I was somewhat amaged to find that Nr. Froschel expected to get this work done within the 24 hours of his arrival. It takes a half a day to present the case to the Consul, then it is necessary for them to check out of the United States into Mexico. Only after they are checked out of the United States does the Consul consent to send a cable. The applicant is required to spend at heast one night on Foreign soil. There are times as in the Karpel case when a Holiday prevents immediate response from the American Consul in Foreign Countries, but we are glad that we were able to serve Mr. Froschel as rapidly as we did.
