As you will see from the papers, the foregoing is a well-known writer and financially able to sustain himself in the United States. We believe you will find all of the documents in good order.

Mr. Froeschel is planning to make Chicago his permanent residence, but has not as yet received a letter from the Chicago bank. If this is necessary, he can obtain it. Since he only came to our city today, he of course is not submitting a police certificate.

Dear Mrs. Weinschenk:-

Re: George Froschel.

It affords me pleasure to inform you that Mr. Froschel received his Austrian quota number and was legally admitted to the United States today.

I was somewhat amazed to find that Mr. Froschel expected to get this work done within the 24 hours of his arrival. It takes a half a day to present the case to the Consul, then it is necessary for them to check out of the United States into Mexico. Only after they are checked out of the United States does the Consul consent to send a cable. The applicant is required to spend at least one night on Foreign soil. There are times as in the Karpel case when a Holiday prevents immediate response from the American Consul in Foreign Countries, but we are glad that we were able to serve Mr. Froschel as rapidly as we did.
