

Dear Mr. King:

Acknowledging receipt of your letter of July 17th, I wish to advise that there is little that anyone can do to help your relative to depart from Poland. However I would make these suggestions:

That he try to make application to go to Santa Domingo to await there his quota number, which will be transferred to him through the American Consul wherever he may located upon advice from him to the American Consul in Warsaw.

There is a possibility because of his family connections in Calexico, that he may get a Tourist Visa into Mexico, however, we have experienced some difficulties in getting people into that country.

Should you desire to try Mexico you may write to Gustavo Arce, Attorney, #39 Palma, Mexico, D. F. This man charges \$100 for each applicant he succeeds in getting into Mexico, or rather I should say attempts to get into Mexico. He demands 1/3 of his fee immediatly, and the balance when the visa is granted in the Foreign Country. However, that is the least of the expense in the Mexican situation. The Government requires a bond of 750 Pesos and the equivalent of about \$25 monthly to be placed in the bank for his maintainance during his stay in Mexico.

Reports show that Equador, the Phillipines and the aforementioned Santa Domingo are possible places for aliens to sojourn who are awaiting quota numbers to enter the United States.
