Dear Miss Razovsky:-

Will you please assist in getting the following documents from Russia: Birth certificate

Brandel Kaminsly, born in Tripoli, Kiev Gub., Russia, 1898. The name of the father is Solomon Kaminsky - the Mother Chana, both of whom live (and are now Amarican citizens) at 408 Seigel Street, Philadelphia, Pa Also marriage certificate.

She married Mathan Ramras in Kiev, Russia in 1921. Mr. Ramros was an Austrian prisoner of war held in Russia during the World War.

We also need a birth certificate for their child, Peretz Ramros, born in Kiev, Russia, about February 28, 1922. At that time they were living at 24 Yrazlavski Street, Kiev, Russia. He was circumcized by Rabbi Kavalsky from Podol.

Since we are in urgent need of the above documents, and would appreciate your using the airmail service. This case comes to us from Mexico City. He reports conditions against the Jews most tragic. We are therefore anxious to help this family enter the United States. They are people of means and well able to maintain themselves. Mr. Ramras has all other necessary documents and is awaiting the aforementioned documents to present his case.
