Dear Mr. Katz:

Replying to yours of July 19th, I wish to state that conditions in Mexico are becoming such that it is almost impossible to get refugees into that Country. They definitely say that they do not want Jews.

I would suggest that you write to the American Friends Service Committee, Philadelphia, Pa., and put your case before them, as believe they are in position to find a haven for our persecuted people in Germany at this time. Should they be unsuccessful, do not hesitate to call upon me again, and I will try Mexico as a last resort.

Please be assured that I am heartily in sympathy with our persecuted people abroad.
