May we ask your interest in behalf of the above client who is eager to immigrate from Poland.

The American relative, Mr. Issic Kotlarchyk, of 283 Jericho Turnpike, Floral Park, N. Y., submitted an affidavit of support but the American Consul in Poland rejected them as they were inadequate and accordingly the above client cannot hope to come to the United States. It is however hoped that she can join her brother in Mexico who when last heard from was residing at the following address:

He has not responded to the letter from the American relative and we are therefore asked to intercede in their behalf.

Your relative, Issic Kotlarchyk, 283 Jericho Turnpike, Floral Park, N. Y., submitted an affidavit of support that the American Consul in Poland rejected as inadequate. However, it is hoped that you will ask her to come to Mexico, and if you decide to have her join you, I would suggest that you have her come to Mexico in transit through the United States. She will then have a better opportunity to permanently enter the United States.
