The Weichselbaum family is still in Juarez awaiting first priority on an agricultural number. Our Consul has again asked for the numbers for this family, as well as for the Waserzuk family.

A first preference quota has been assured to one, Max Phillapowsky, whose American wife lives in Omaha, Nebraska. This number is issued for November, so I have very little hope for the Weishselbaum family getting in prior to that time. These are all Polish quotas.

We are expecting the return papers on the Pola Gershbein Borenstein case, who will be admitted as a non-quota, due to her husband being an American citizen. These papers are now before the Commissioner General in Washington for his approval.
