The colors of Delta Delta Delta are silver, gold, and blue. The flower is the pansy.

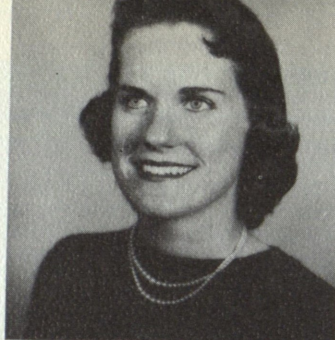

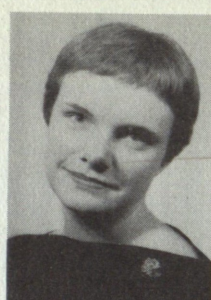

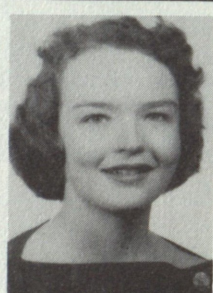

At present there are sixty active members on campus. The sorority colors are turquoise blue and steel grey and the white violet is their flower.





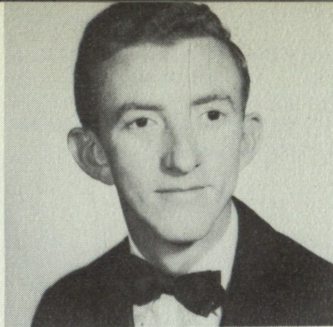

Lambda Chi Alpha

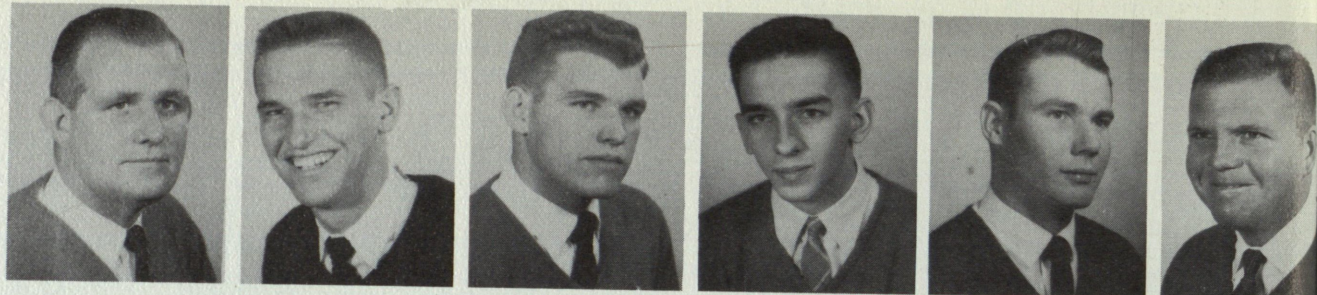

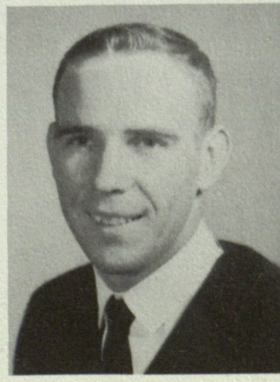
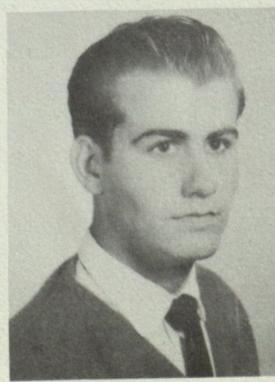
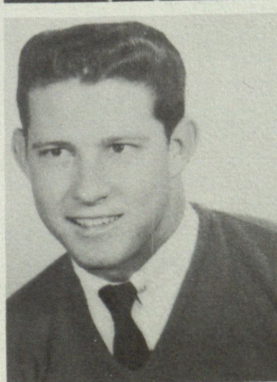
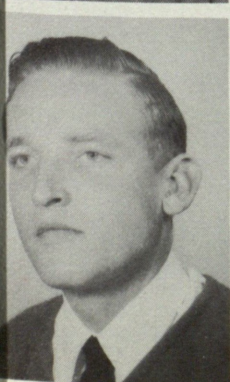
Epsilon Xi of Kappa Sigma was organized on the campus of Texas Western in 1949 and the lodge was completed in the fall of 1952.

Phi Kappa Tau participates in all school activities and at present has two Men of Mines, four Alpha Chi members, one class representative, and one class officer.

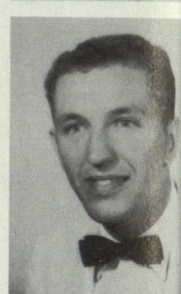
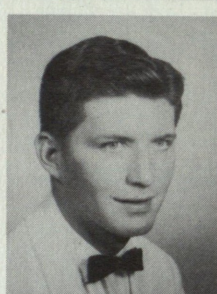
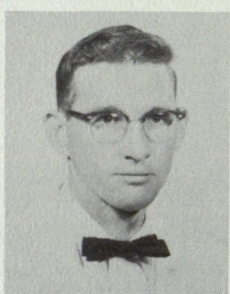
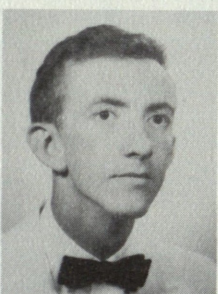
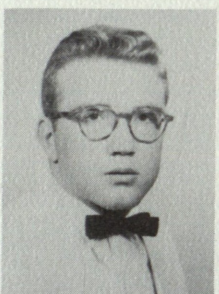

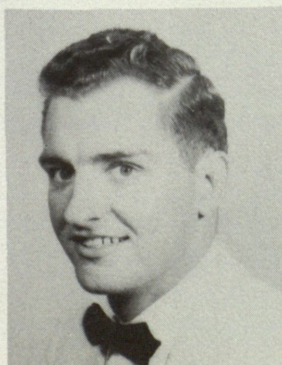
The fraternity is represented by having three members in WHO'S WHO, three Men of Mines, the Intramural Director and four DMS students.

The fifty-four actives and twelve pledges participate in all campus activities. Their act for Variety Show placed second this year. They won sweepstakes in this years Homecoming Parade.

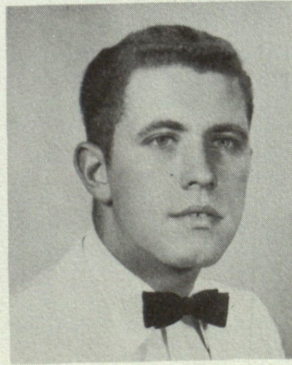
There are over 350 active SAE's in the El Paso area and the chapter has always had a strong alumni organization back of them.

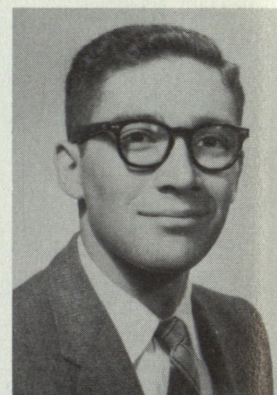
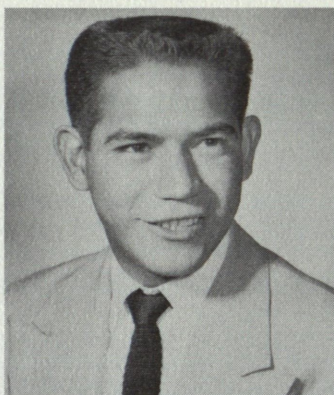




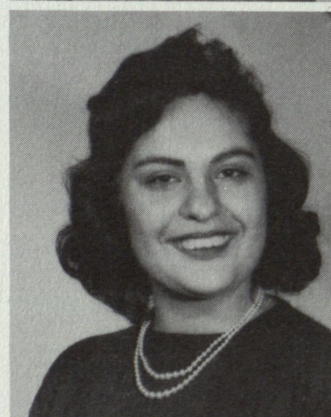
Phi Gamma Nu

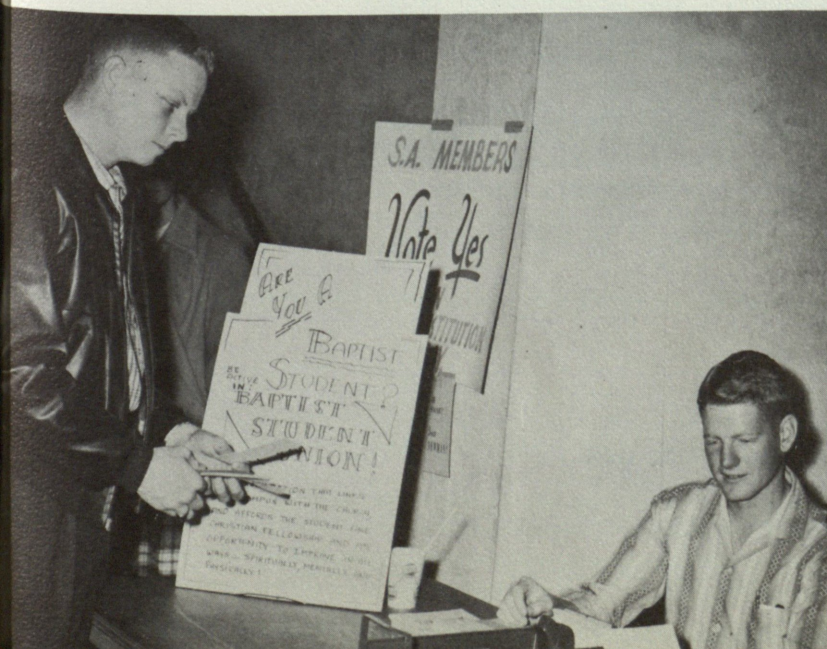

Probable Texas Western starting line-up throughout the season.

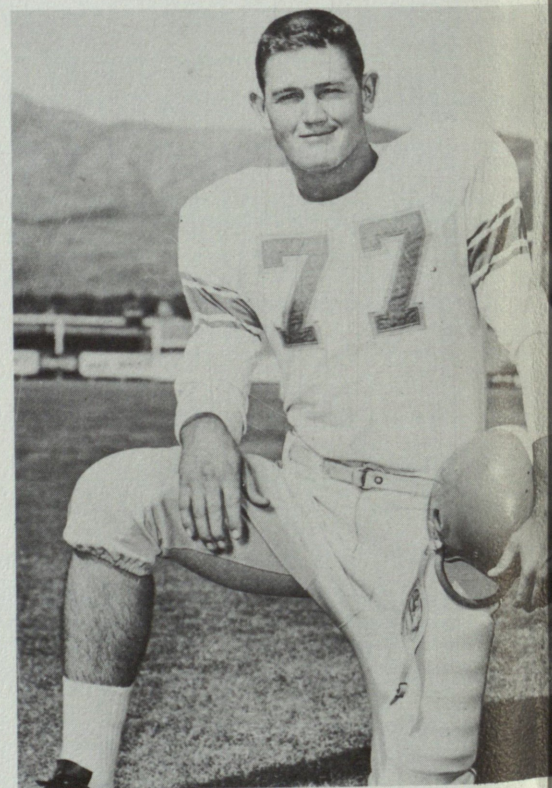

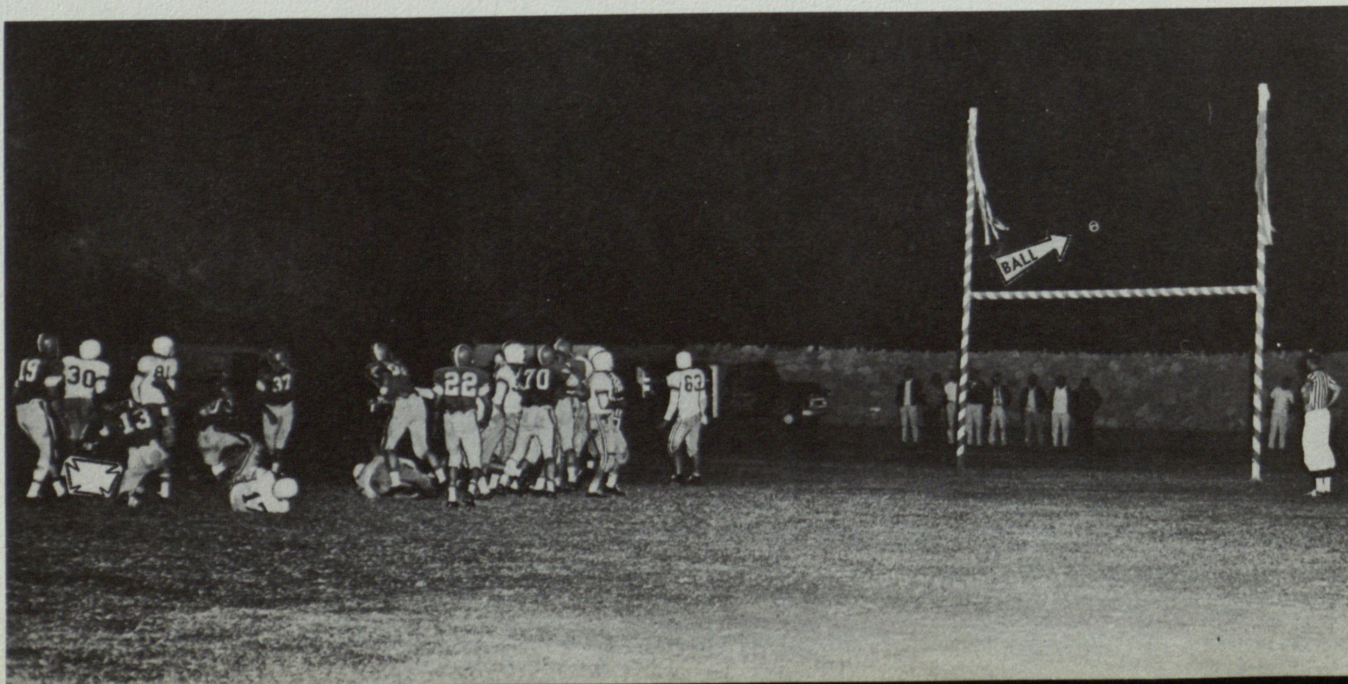

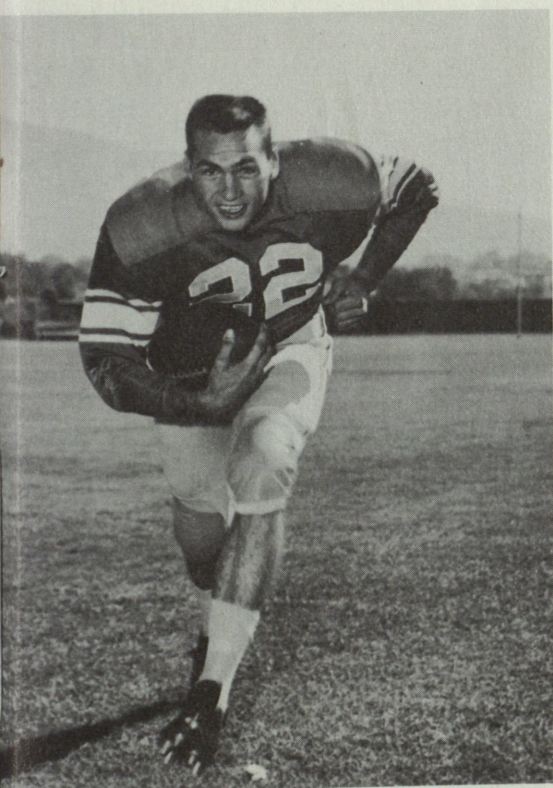


TEXAS WESTERN 14
