Dear Miss Razovsky:-

Re: Sarah (Selma)Levine.

Please trace Miss Levine for us. She is at the present time in New York. This girl was admitted into the United States in 1927 on a Students Visa. She went to California, attended school there for about three years. For, the past year the school has failed to make report on her and the Government is trying to trace her because she is now considered illegally in the United States. She has relatives in El Paso, but they refuse to co-operate and we fear that unless we get information to her, that she will ~~xxx~~ eventually be apprehended and deported. She will then be unable to return to the U.S. Her Cousin, Mr. Blumberg, 125 Fifth Ave., N. Y., may assist you in finding this girl. Should you be successful, please inform her of the difficulties that may face her should the Government reach her before she returns to Mexico. In the mean-time send me her address at the earliest possible moment.

We visited Mr. Blumberg who is a young man. He stated that Miss Levin is supposed to be in Los Angeles, California. The girl is a third cousin of his, but he has not been in direct communication with her, and assured visitor that he did not know of her whereabouts.

Mr. Blumberg promised to help us try to obtain Miss Levin's present address, and we will therefore keep in touch with him.
