Dear Mr. Safdie;

Replying to your letter of Feb. 5th. with reference to your son Jack I would advise you to have affidavits of support from three relatives, who are American Citizens. You will state that your son is of individual Syrian Birth. I would also advise that you get your Congressmen Mr. Dickstein to write a letter to the American Consul in Juarez Mexico.to give your son recognition when he applies for entry into the U.S.

When your son Abe, is in Washington it would be advisable for him to get in touch with the Dept. of Labor and ask their consideration for your sons entry. As soon as the affidavits are received at this end of the line and also, a letter of credit to the sum of about \$2000.00 your son will immediately apply to the American Consul in Juarez and we can start working from this end of the line and you and your son Abe will assist from Washington.
