



Dear Dr. Engerman:

Your cousin, Aaron Margolis, now living in C. Juarez, Mexico, where he is established in business, has asked me to assist him in filing papers for permanent entry into the United States. He wishes to make his home in El Paso, Texas and continue his business in Juarez, which is just across the border. His reason for wanting to live in the United States, is so that his children can benefit from both an American and Hebrew education. He is financially able to take care of himself and family and can meet any and all financial requirements.

However, the Government requires sponsorship in the form of an affidavit for anyone entering the United States, and since you and your brother Sam Engerman are his only relatives in the United States, he would appreciate your acting as one of his sponsors. Two sponsors are required, but one is being taken care of here by a friend. The enclosed Part C is the form you will have to sign, and am sending this to you so that you can familiarize yourself with what is required.
