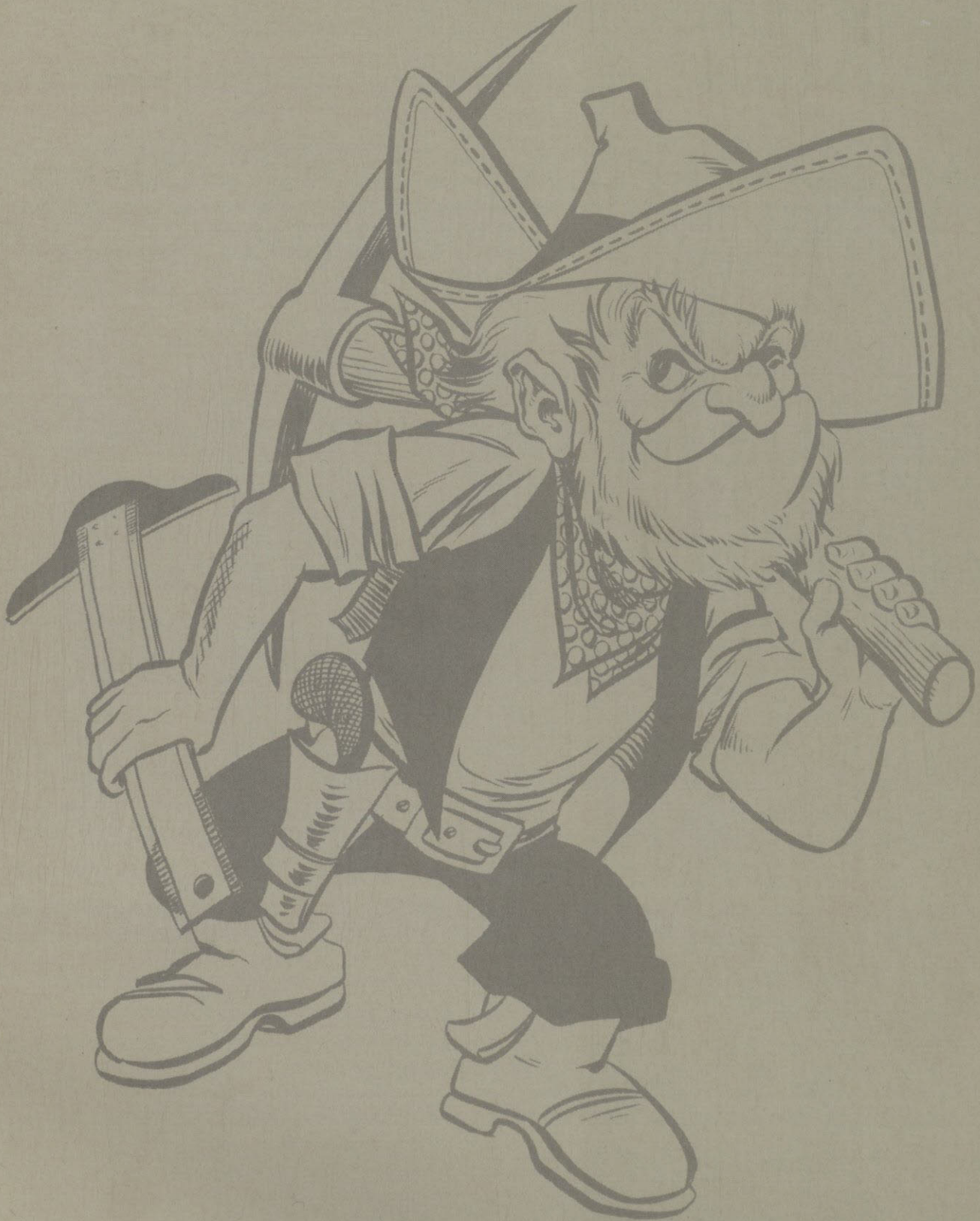

FLOWSHEET DEDICATION OF 1959

His services and contributions to Texas Western College began in 1927 when the college, then Texas College of Mines, was founded. During his thirty-two years here, he has more than adequately filled the positions of Assistant, Associate, and full-time Professor in the Science Department.

Born in Richwood, Ohio, he attended Richwood High School before entering Ohio State University, where he received his Bachelor of Science Degree in chemistry and physics. In 1921 he received his Master of Science Degree in chemistry and math, and in 1941 he obtained his Ph.D in chemistry and math from the University of Chicago. Since then he has had several articles published in scientific magazines.

He served as the assistant in the Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry at Ohio State University from 1912-13. He holds membership in Sigma Xi, Phi Lambda Upsilon, the American Chemical Society, Fellow American Association for the Advancement of Science, and he is a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon Social Fraternity. Before entering the Education field, he was the chemist for the National Carbon Company in Cleveland in 1913, and then from 1913-14 he served as the Chief Chemist for the William Edwards Company also in Cleveland. He has enjoyed experimenting with the effects of certain chemicals upon the soil and plants.

Our honoree married Grace Harris in Shreveport, Louisiana. They have a daughter, Frances Ellen, who attended Texas Western College, and is now married and living in El Paso.

As most of you have concluded by now, the Flowsheet Staff dedicates its 1959 yearbook to *Dr. William Walter Lake*. Dr. Lake's contributions to Texas Western and to the scientific world have been great. Our college is indeed fortunate to have on its staff such an outstanding person.

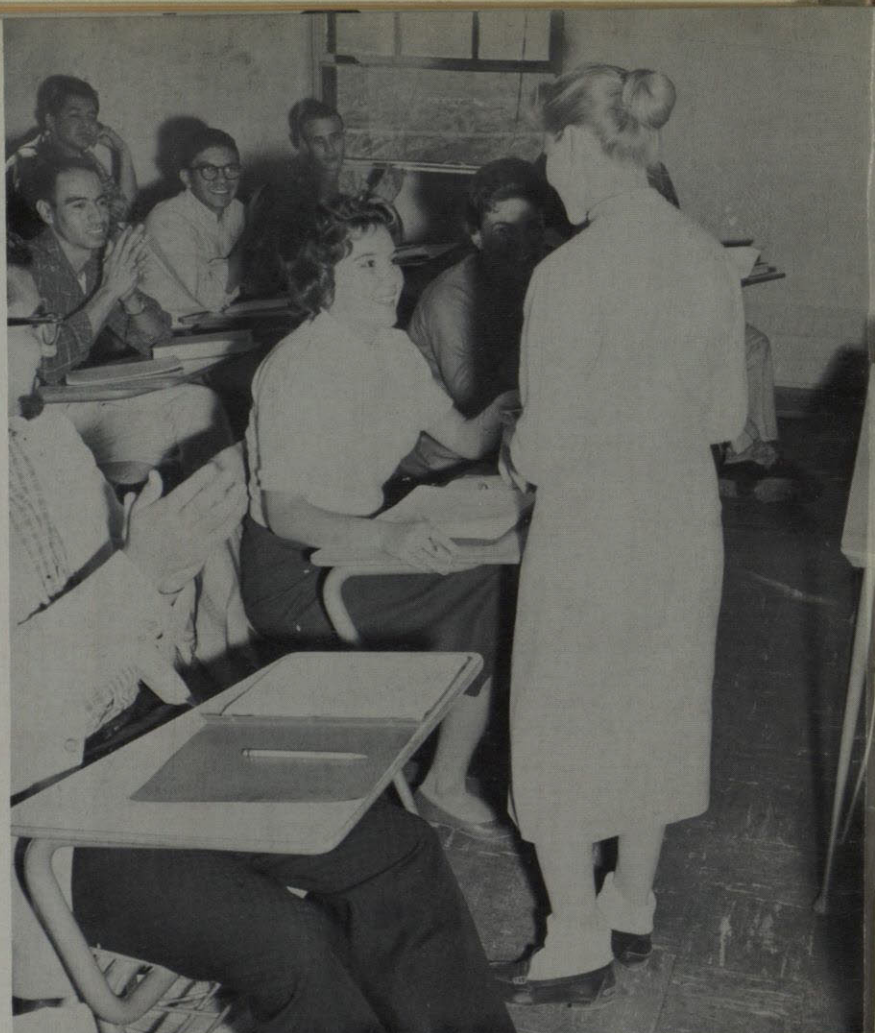

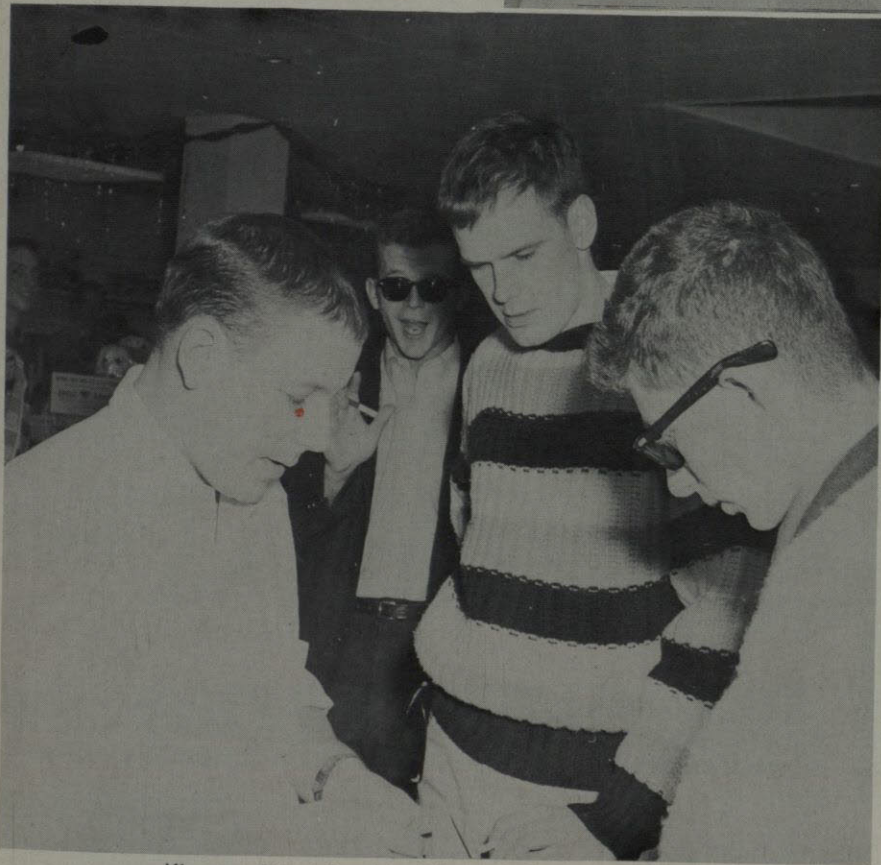

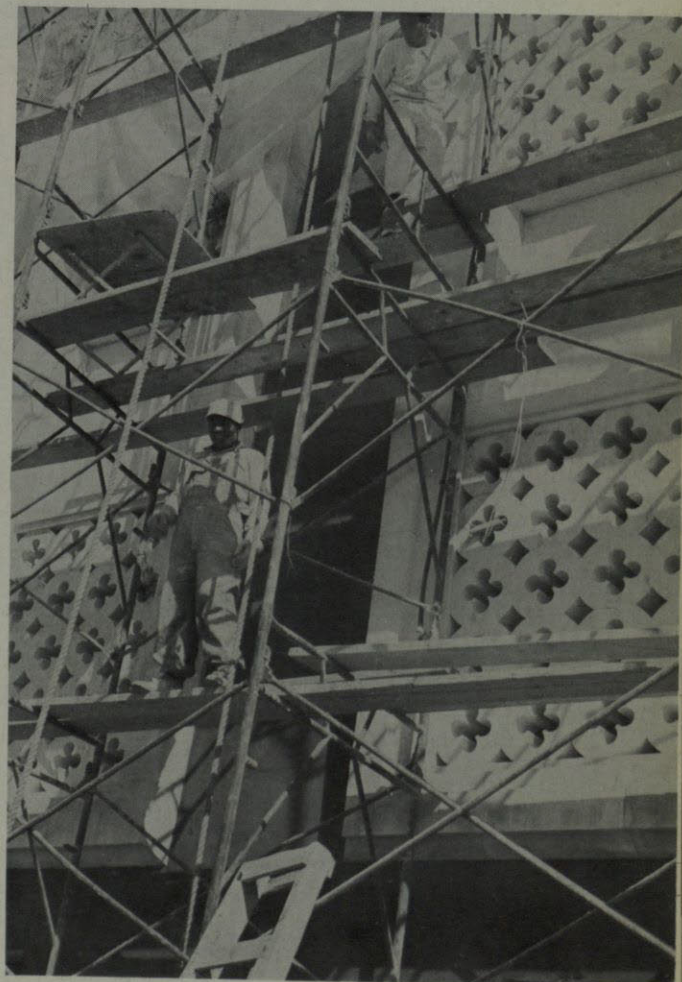

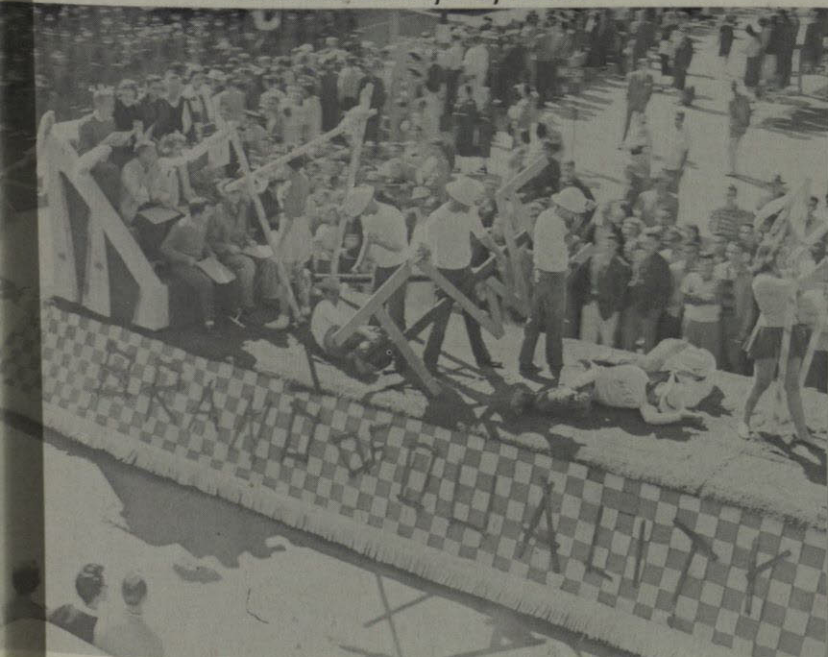
the spirit of the college . . .

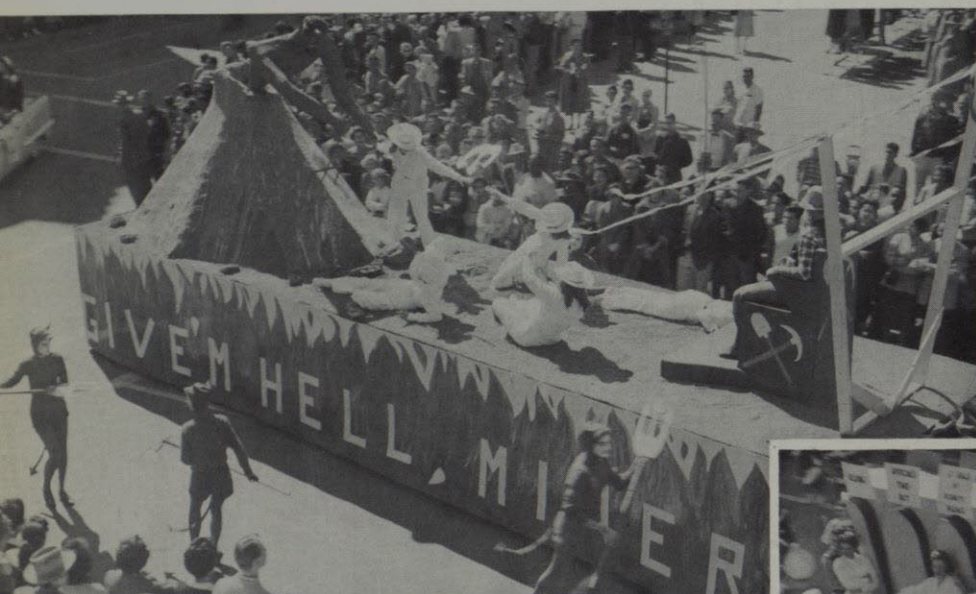

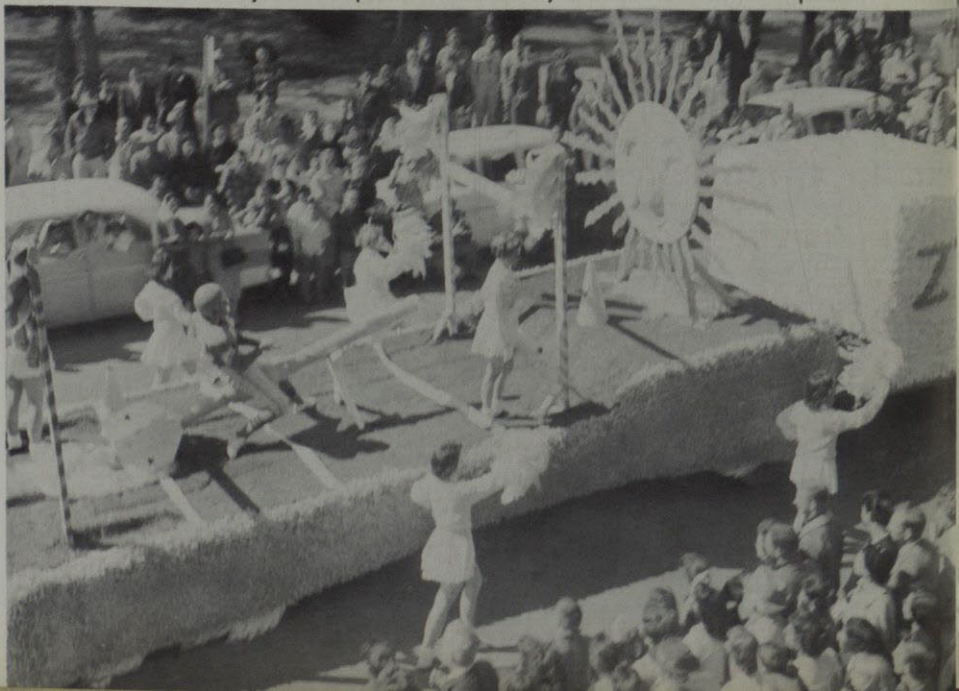

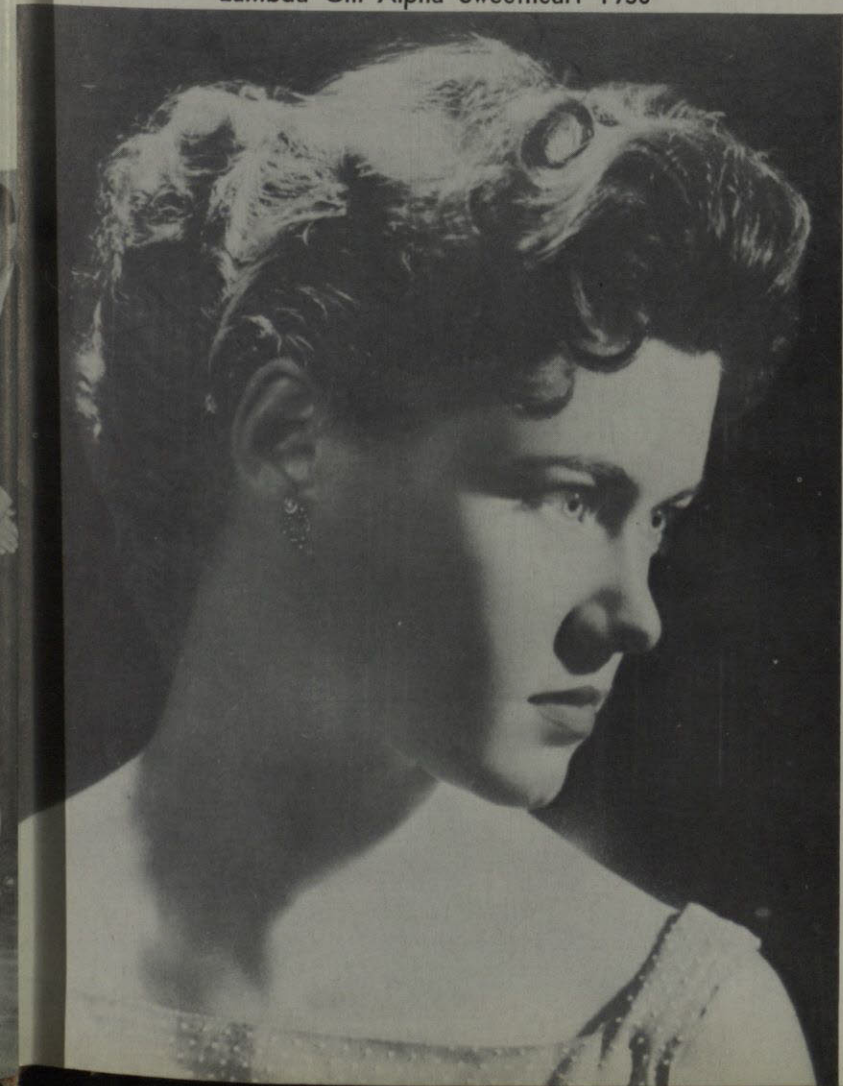

The Co-Ed Council proudly surround their monarch, King TEX, alias Bill Huff.

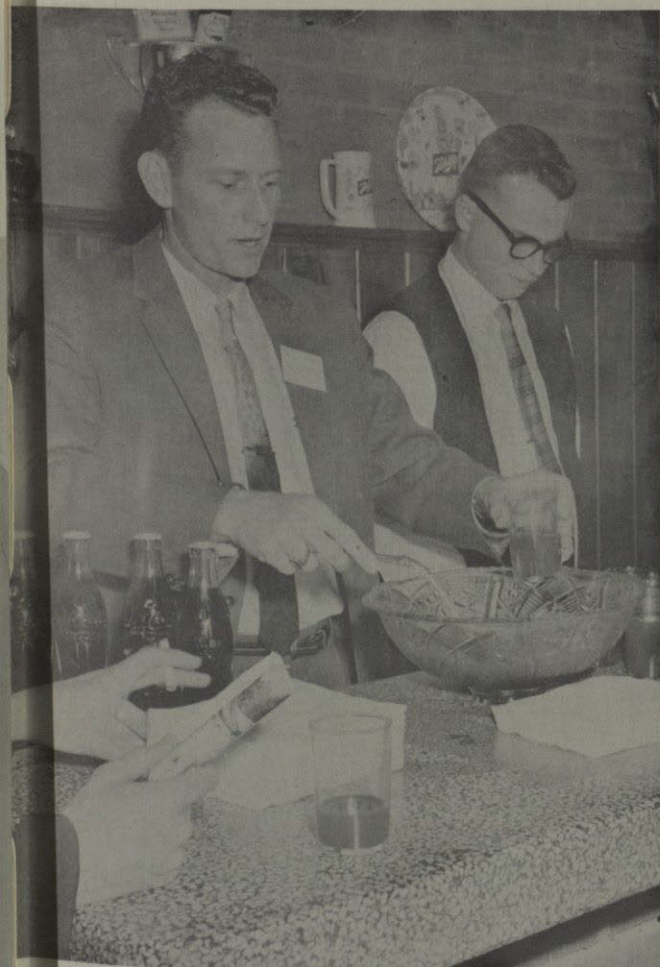

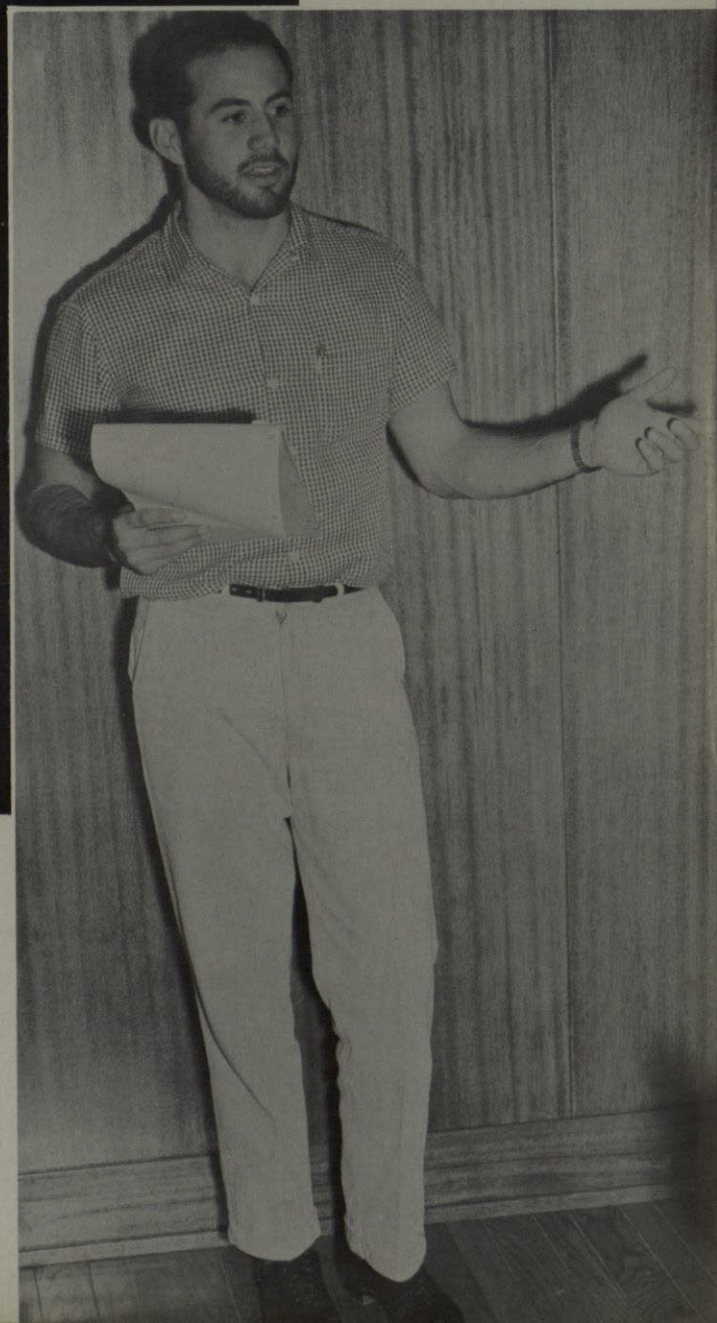

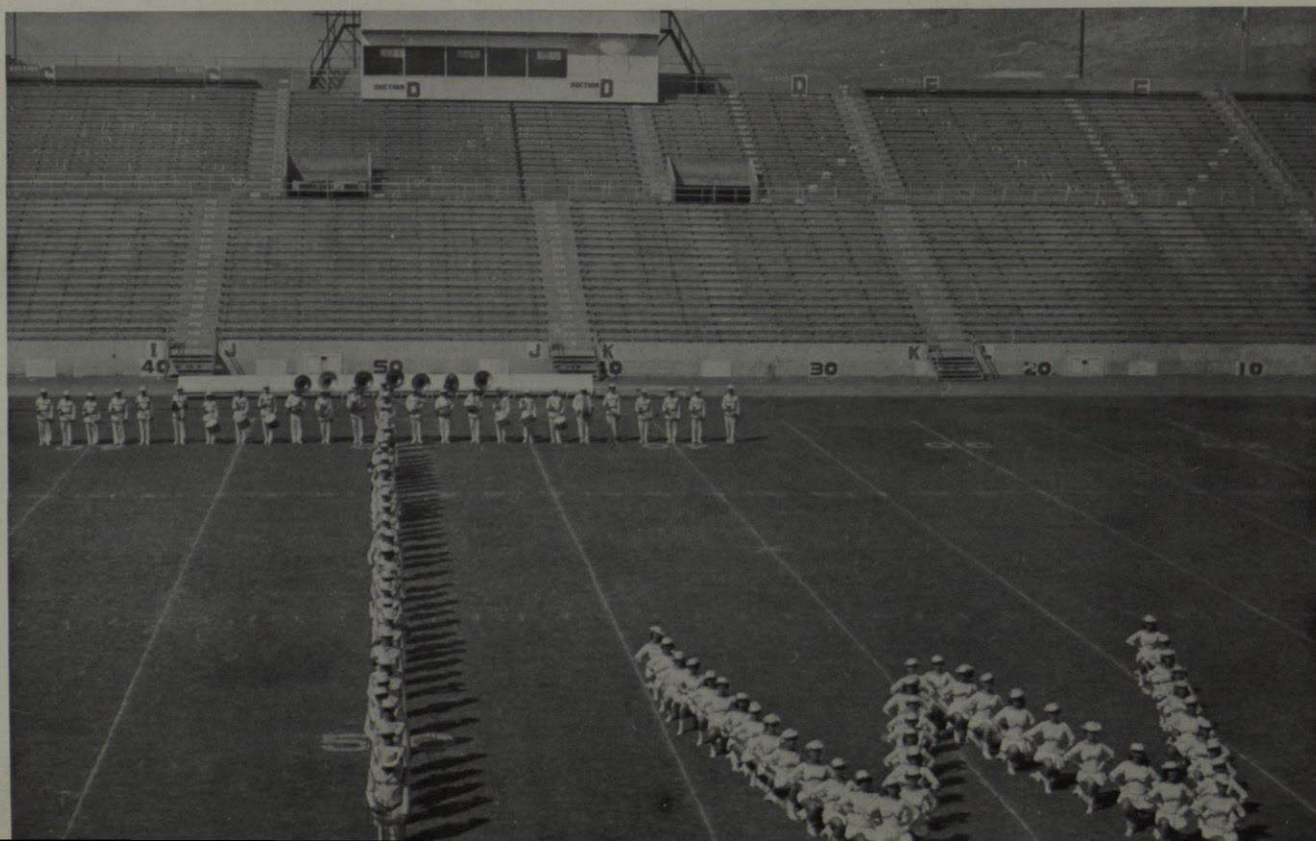

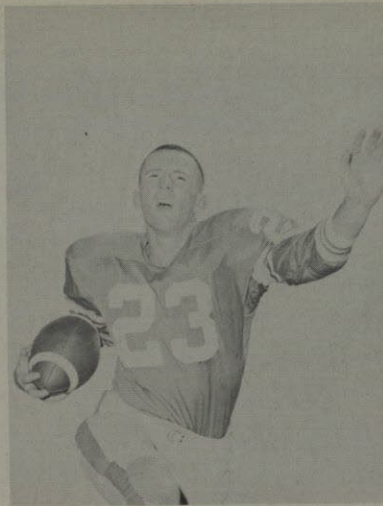
NTS Drops TWC, 26-8

A 13-yard field goal by New Mexico A&M provided the margin for victory in the Aggie-Miner contest.

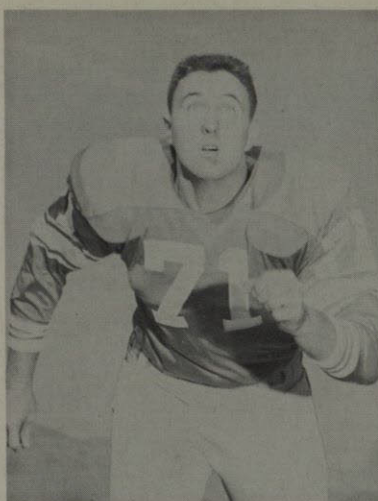

ball, swimming and golf were offered.

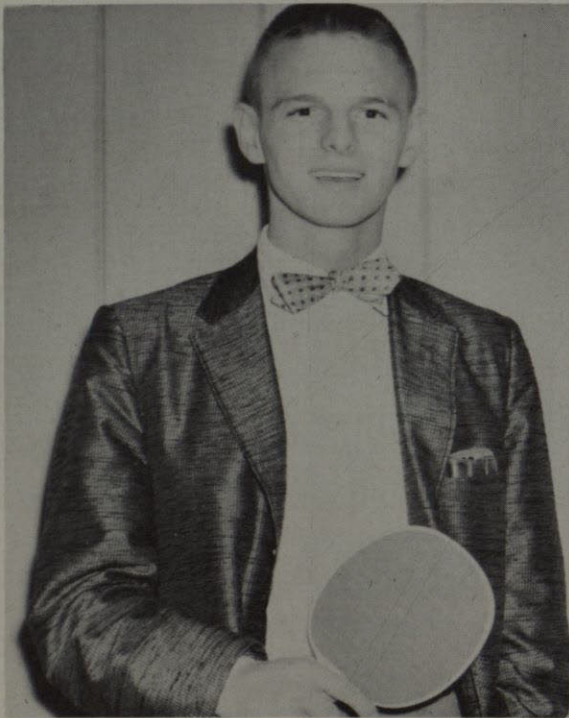
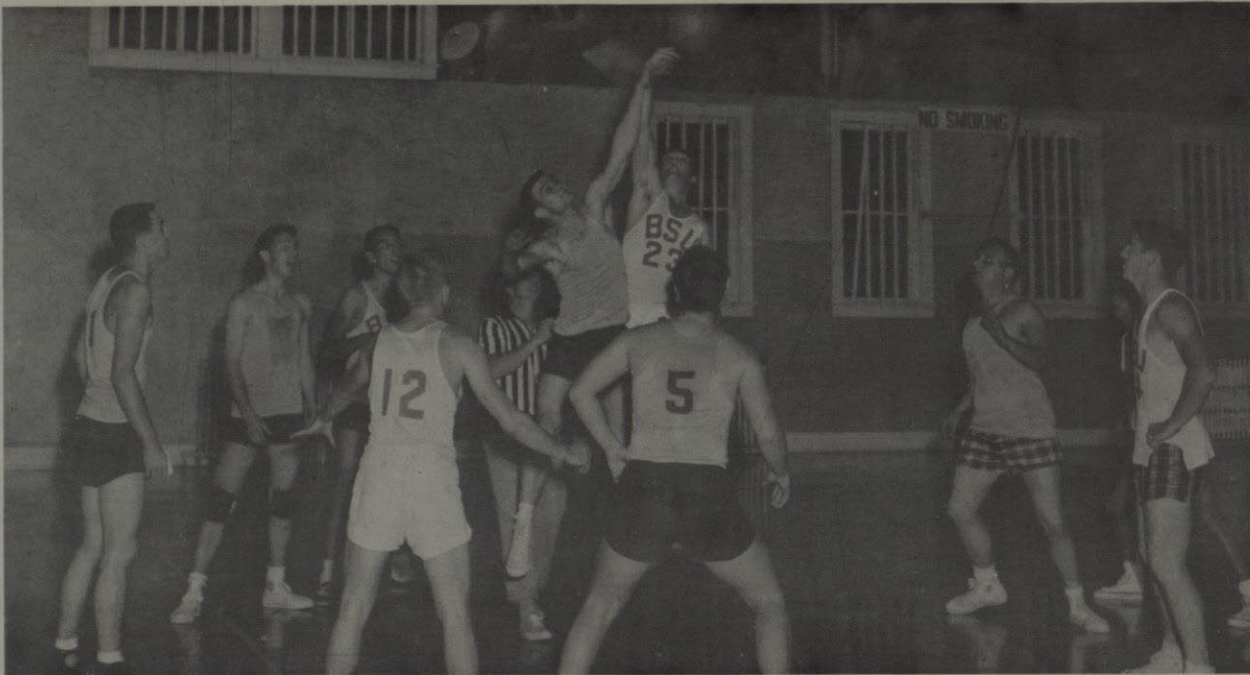
The Pre-Med Club showed surprising strength throughout the first semester in

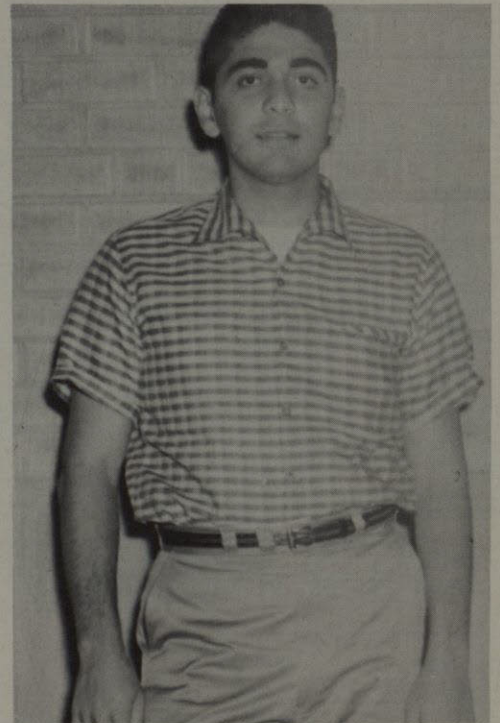

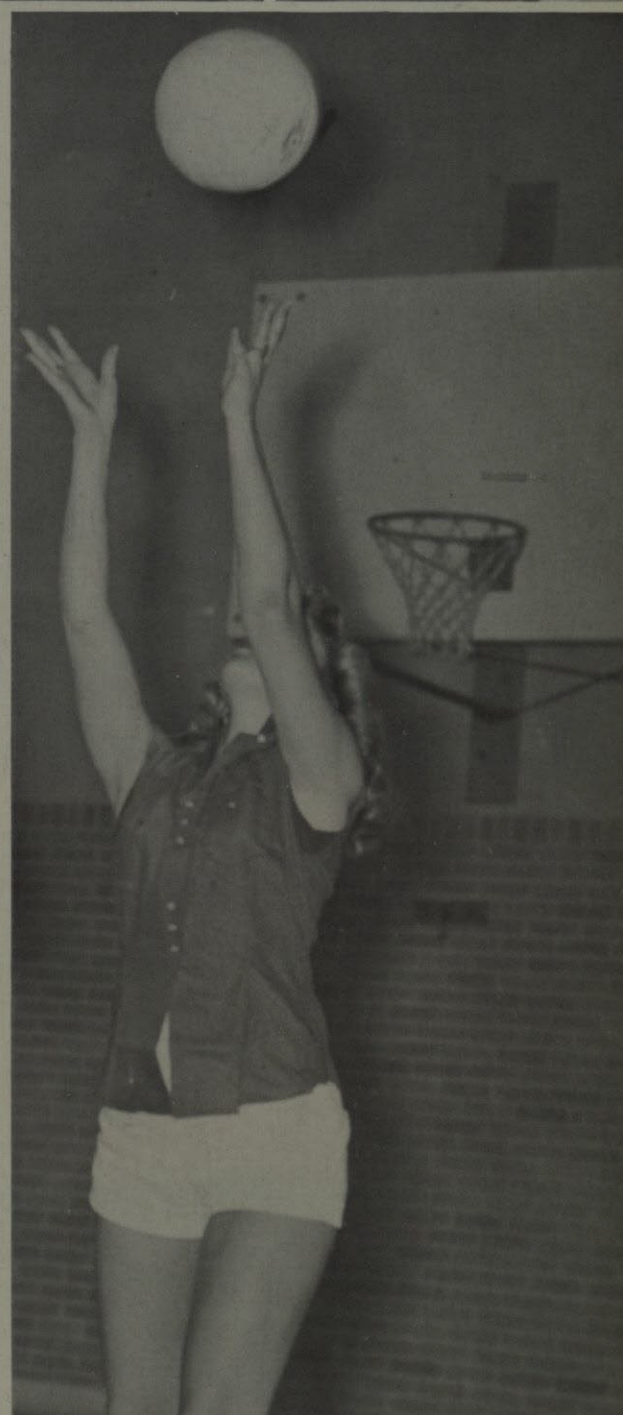
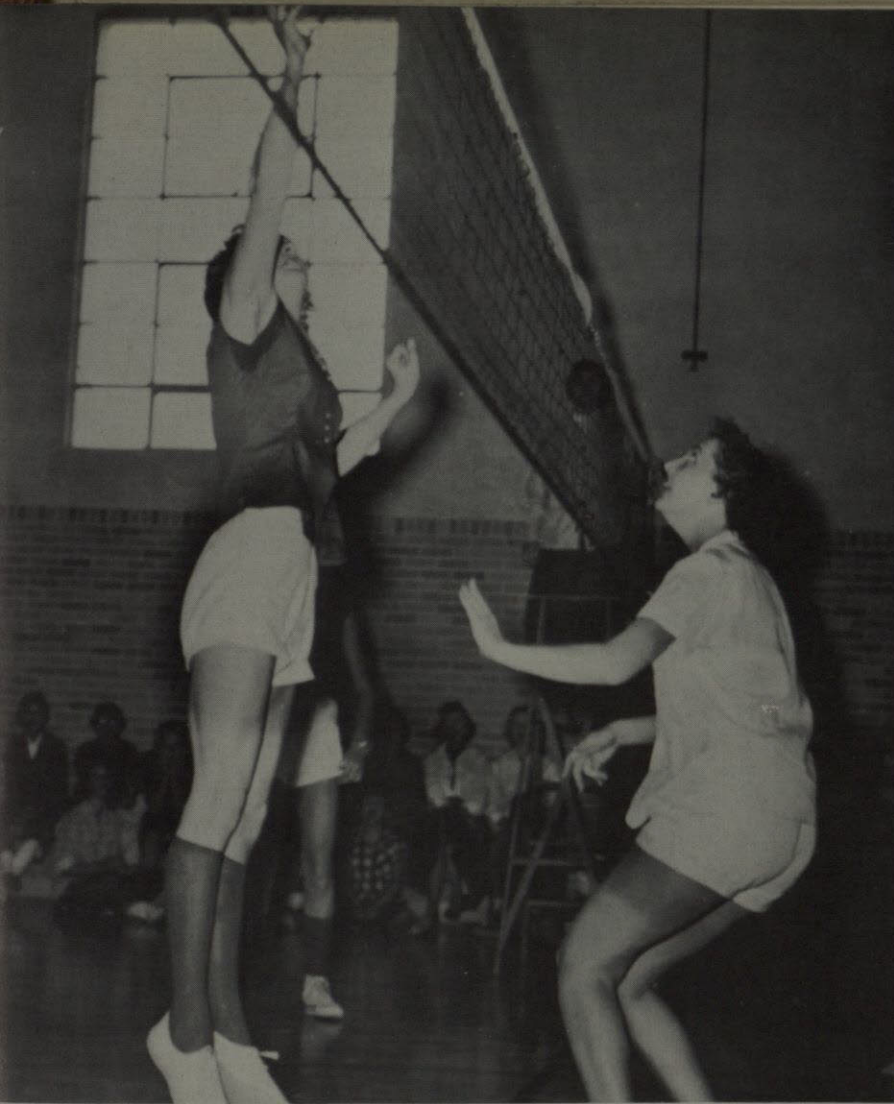
More than 100 women participated during the year in 7 sports—volleyball, basketball, tennis, ping pong, badminton, softball, and swimming.

The Administration Building is the most recent addition to this campus. Its completion in 1956 provided separate quarters for the administrative offices for the first time in the history of the College. It is distinguished by the unique feature of having a central foyer in the center of the building, dispensing with hallways.

The President's Residence was acquired for that purpose in 1943. Previously it had been rented for College use at various times from private owners. In 1933 it had been refurnished through efforts of the College Women's Auxiliary as an athletes' dormitory. Originally it had been the home of V. E. Ware, El Paso contractor who had charge of the construction of the original buildings on this campus.

The Business Manager's Residence was built in 1920 by Dean S. H. Worrell for his home on his own land, abutting on University property. In 1923 it was added to the Campus to serve as an official residence; occupied by Dean John W. Kidd until his death; and since 1941 by successive Business Managers.

The Library was designed as administration and library building in 1938. In 1956 Administration moved out and the building was converted to exclusive library use. Recent additions have expanded the Library substantially.



The Student Union Building, years in the planning and hoping, finally went up in 1948. It has been virtually doubled in size by the addition of a wing on the south, just recently completed.

Magoffin Auditorium commemorates a historic figure, James Wiley Magoffin (1799-1868), pioneer in Southwest history and founder of the Magoffin line in El Paso. Its construction in 1950 provided a center for the Department of Music and the Depart-

ment of Speech and Drama.

The Cotton Memorial Building went up in 1947 as the College home of the Fine and Applied Arts, in accordance with the intentions of Frank B. Cotton (1844-1907). It was financed out of funds from the El Paso estate accumulated by this Boston industrialist who believed tangibly in the future of El Paso when it was still a hamlet.

DORMITORIES PROVIDE HOMES FOR STUDENTS

Bell Hall, women's dormitory built in 1948, was dedicated in 1950 "in the memory of Elizabeth Merrill Bell, 1846-1928, for her many contributions to the development of the College." She had distinguished herself in the early activities of the Women's Association for the College of Mines, now the Auxiliary.

Miners Hall has served as the athletes' dormitory since its opening in 1950. Its name honors the athletic teams who have carried the name of Miners onto the playing fields of the Southwest for the past 45 years. The bill that established T. W. C. read: "A School of Miners (Mines) and Metallurgy is hereby created for the State of Texas..."

Worrell Hall opened in 1936 as simply the Men's Dormitory. Four years later it was given its name in memory of S. H. Worrell. Dean Worrell "conceived the idea that the State should have a

mining school" and founded this institution in 1914, serving as its dean until 1923. Mrs. Worrell, an artist and writer, suggested the Bhutanese motif which was adopted for T. W. C. architecture.

Benedict Hall, built in 1936, was just the Women's Dormitory until 1940. It was named in honor of H. Y. Benedict (1863-1937), president of the University of Texas from 1927 until his death, who had been a special friend to the College. In 1957 Benedict Hall became a men's dormitory.

Hudspeth Hall, men's dormitory built in 1948, received its name in 1950. It honors Claude B. Hudspeth (1877-1941), best remembered as West Texas Congressman from El Paso 1919-36. His services to T.W.C., then the State School of Mines, dated from his years in the Texas legislature in 1902-18.

The Geology Building in its present form and function dates from 1951, when last enlarged and remodeled. As the Chemistry Building it had been included in the original group of buildings.

Kelly Hall, the first building to be added to the original group, was named for C. E. Kelly (1864-1933), father of Associate Professor Mary Kelly Quinn, who served on the Board of Regents from 1917 to 1923. "Kelly" opened in 1921 as a second dormitory. Seven years later it became a classroom building in the form that we know today except for interior alterations in 1933 and 1938.

The Centennial Museum was allocated to the College in 1936 by the El Paso County Advisory Committee for the Texas Centennial Celebration. It houses archeological, paleontological, and mineralogical collections, devoting itself particularly to the Southwest and its history.

Seamon Hall, built in 1927, was named in memory of William H. Seamon (1859-1927), professor of geology and mining from 1919 until his death. Seamon Hall, now headquarters for the Department of Mining and Metallurgy, was expanded to its present size in 1940-41.

The Engineering Building stands as the end-result of a series of additions to the Power Plant of 1917, begun in 1936. The third floor was added in 1949; expansion to the present size was completed in 1955. The Power Plant still stands, but it has been completely surrounded within the structure.

Burges Hall, another of the original buildings, opened in 1917 as the Dormitory. It remained officially Dormitory (and unofficially "Keno Hall") until 1933, when it was converted into a classroom building and named for William H. Burges (1867-1946), first El Pasoan to serve as a Regent of the University of Texas.

The El Paso Natural Gas Company laboratory building, completed in 1958, is technically not a part of the T.W.C. campus. But its architecture was revised to harmonize with the College motif by special effort of E. P. N. G. and its program in research and development involves cooperation with the College faculty and student body.



SCIENCE BUILDING

The Science Building has contained the Chemistry Department and the Department of Biological Sciences since its construction in 1950. Its completion made it possible for the Chemistry Department to surrender the building it had occupied since the founding of the College to Geology.

Holliday Hall, men's gymnasium, honors Robert L. Holliday, (1883-1954), member of the Board of Regents in 1927-1933. He had promoted the building program which furnished the College with this building and an expanded athletic field. His brother, Thomas C. Holliday, is remembered as one of our college's early coaches.

Kidd Field had its beginnings in a small stadium constructed in 1921 by Dean John W. Kidd (1880-1941) for the College athletic program. Until 1933 it went nameless. In that year it was expanded to present dimensions and named for "Cap" Kidd, "the father of football at Mines... who coached the first team and... built the original field..."—Shown on page 169.

The Physics Building dominated the original campus in 1917. In those days it was the Main Building. It was renamed in 1951, following minor alterations to its present form. "Old Main" is considered the example most faithful to the Buthanese motif basic to Campus architecture.
