Mr. Hermann Horn is a very highly esteemed member of our community. He is a dealer in ready-made clothes for men and women and is quite well-to-do. His daughter Hildegard is 30 years old and single. She is employed in her father's business. She went to High School and received the High-School diploma. She did not go to college afterwards but instead took a course in decoration and cutting; she does the buying for her father's business and is said to be very efficient. We are enclosing a photo of Miss Horn.

As to the relatives of Mr. Horn we can give you the following informations. They seem to be located in Los Angeles or in Roswell. Then there is the address of a firm by the name of J. Calisher & Co., also at Roswell, New Mexico.

We should be greatly obliged if you would confirm this letter and let us know whether you are going to take up the affidavit matter of Miss Horn. You may answer us in English.

May we ask your further interest in behalf of the above client about whom you last wrote us in January 1939.

The client is now residing at 77 Durleigh Road, Bridge-water, England where she has a household position. She is very eager to immigrate to the United States and believes that her turn in the quota will soon be reached, as applicants in Germany bearing the same registration number are now being called up for examination.

Client's sister, Dr. Liselotte Horn, has been residing in New York since her arrival in this country on February 14, 1939. She resides at 56 East 91st Street, and is maintaining herself as a masseuse pending her New York State Board examination, which will enable her to practice medicine in this State.

Dr. Horn will therefore be responsible for client, if and when she arrives in the United States, but she is unable to furnish an affidavit as she has no assets and her earnings are just enough to maintain herself.

As a year has elapsed since affidavits were last submitted, it will now be necessary to submit new affidavits, and we would therefore suggest that you communicate with the relatives in your city to urge the preparation of new affidavits.

When you last communicated with us, you indicated that Mrs. Calisher and her grandson, Max E. Moey had sent affidavits direct to clients.

At this time, we would prefer that the affidavits be sent to this office, as we would in turn send them to the German Jewish Committee in London. The affidavits are now to be prepared only for Hildegard Horn in England.

THAT he is Certified Public Accountant holding unrevoked Certificate No. 24 issued by the State Board of Accountancy of the State of Texas, and has been engaged in the practice of Public Accountancy continuously since 1912.

THAT he has been a resident of El Paso, Texas, since 1913, and since November 8, 1915, has resided continuously at 1207 Cincinnati St., El Paso, Texas.

THAT since sometime in 1916, he has had a close personal acquaintance with the Moye and Calisher families, as for a period of some ten or twelve years, they occupied the premises at 1201 Cincinnati St., adjoining the residence of the deponent.

THAT he is personally acquainted with Mrs. Ada F. Calisher, now living at 1431 Hawthorne Place, El Paso, Texas, and has known her since 1913, and has prepared her income tax returns for many years, including 1939.

We received your letter of February 3rd, together with the two sets of affidavits executed by Mrs. Ada F. Calisher and Mr. Max Moye.

Although you have already indicated that you were unable to get further documentary evidence, we believe that it is useless to send these affidavits abroad in their present form.

1. Mrs. Calisher's affidavit does not even give the source of the income of \$2,500.00. It is certainly important to state the source of this income.
2. Does the real estate consist of a home in which Mrs. Calisher resides, or does she derive an income from it?

Mr. Moye's affidavit has certain discrepancies which will surely be noticed by the American Consul abroad.

Mr. Moye states that he owns a half interest in a \$30,000.00 realty, and that he has \$10,000.00 insurance. These figures are at variance with the small annual income of \$1,200.00.

We would suggest, that as Mrs. Calisher and Mr. Moye apparently reside in the same house, that they sign a joint letter, explaining their mode of living and source of income, which will add some strength and credence to the documents already submitted.

If the affidavits could be bolstered up by these various suggestions, we would feel better about sending them abroad, as the present form of the documents precludes any possibility of success.
