#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

The Sonnichsen family started out in an area of Denmark that is now part of Germany. They immigrated to the United States because Momme-Melf, C.L. Sonnichsen's grandfather, did not want to join the Danish military. The Sonnichsens moved first to New York, and then to Iowa, because Momme-Melf did not feel safe in New York.

Henry Matthew Sonnichsen (H.M.S.), son of Momme-Melf, was born in Denmark, but grew up in Iowa working very hard, as the family was poor. He met Mary Hults (M.H.S.) and married her in 1899. They first settled in Iowa where Charles Leland was born in 1901, but then moved to Hancock, Minnesota because of the better climate. Henry and Mary tried farming and would have been successful if not for Henry's allergies.

While in Hancock, their second son Lloyd was born in 1903, and third son Harold in 1912. In 1916, the family moved to Wadena, Minnesota. Soon after moving, tragedy stuck the Sonnichsen's when Lloyd died of a gunshot wound. In Wadena, the Sonnichsen family was involved in the community through both church and school. Henry worked at various jobs and Mary worked in the community through the Seventh Day Adventists, her church.

Charles Leland graduated from high school in 1920. He went to the University of Minnesota for his bachelor's degree and Harvard for his Master's and Ph. D. He then went on to teach in El Paso at the Texas College of Mines, later renamed the University of Texas at El Paso. Harold finished high school in Wadena and went to Harvard and the Texas College of Mines for undergraduate work, then back to Harvard where he received his Ph.D. in Chemistry.

After the winters got too bad for Henry and Mary Sonnichsen in Minnesota, they moved to El Paso to be near their son, Charles Leland (about 1950). Henry died in 1954, but Mary lived until 1971. Charles Leland lived until 1991, and at this time (1996) Harold is still living and working with his family in Massachusetts.

#### SERIES DESCRIPTION

The Sonnichsen Family Papers are arranged in five series:

Series I. Correspondence, 1920-1990. 42.5 linear inches (8.5 document boxes)

Arranged in three subseries -- Family, Friends and Relatives, and Personal Business. This material includes correspondence between nuclear family members, and with extended family and close friends. The personal business materials include papers about property and funeral arrangements.

Series II. Genealogy, 1937-1990. 2.5 linear inches (5 folders).

Arranged into two subseries -- Correspondence and Other. This material includes correspondence with family members about their genealogy, family trees and family histories.

Series III. Photographs, 1956-1960, n.d. 2.5 linear inches. (8 folders).

Arranged in one series alphabetically. This material includes photocopies of family portraits and snapshots of places of importance to family members.

Series IV. Other, no date. 2 linear inches (4 folders).

Arranged in one series alphabetically. This material includes family memoirs, a scrapbook, and a school book.

Series V. Newspapers, 1940-1984. 3 linear inches (3 folders).

Arranged in one series alphabetically. This material includes photocopies of newspapers from Wadena and Hancock, Minnesota.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Sonnichsen Family Papers contain eleven boxes and consists primarily of correspondence between Leland, Harold and their parents, Henry and Mary. There is also correspondence with cousins, uncles, aunts, other relatives and friends. Besides correspondence, there are some photocopies of photographs, newspapers and genealogy materials. Most of the materials in this collection are photocopies of originals that are still in the possession of Harold Sonnichsen.

The **Correspondence** series incorporates the Family correspondence that includes letters between Leland, Harold, Henry (H.M.S.), and Mary (M.H.S.). Family members have gone back and dated some of the letters. They were a close family and kept in contact over the years from 1920 until 1990. Not all the letters are present, but there are quite a few and a picture can be drawn of life in the Sonnichsen family. The next largest group of correspondence is between the nuclear Sonnichsen family and friends and relatives. This group of people includes friends from Iowa and Minnesota and relatives from the Sonnichsen, Clifton and Hults families (see appendices for family tree). The last subseries is Personal Business which includes materials on the death of Henry Matthew Sonnichsen, and the property in Wadena, Minnesota.

The **Genealogy** series gives the textual history and genealogy of the Clifton and Hults family (Mary's side), while the **Photographs** series shows the portraits of the family and some of the places they lived.

Included with the **Other** series, are the memoirs of H.M.S., M.H.S., and the Sonnichsen Pilgrimage. The memoirs tell the story of the Sonnichsens - how Henry and Mary met, who their descendants are, and what Henry and Mary did with their lives. Both are useful for a family history. There are also photocopies of H.M.S.'s geography book and a scrapbook.

The final series, **Newspapers**, are photocopies of newspapers from Hancock and Wadena, Minnesota for various years (1940, 1966-1969, 1975, 1977, 1981, 1984). These are examples of what was happening in those particular towns, and gives news of family friends.

#### PROVENANCE

In 1993, with the dedication of the C. L. Sonnichsen Special Collections Department, Harold Sonnichsen (C. L.'s brother) agreed to donate photocopies of the family correspondence. It arrived in three boxes, and in 1996 Harold Sonnichsen signed a deed of gift.
