Biographical Sketch

During the early 1900s – 1920s, the Ginther family was involved in the operation of various mines in the southwestern United States and northern Mexico. These mines were located in Arizona, New Mexico, West Texas, and Chihuahua. The most significant mine owned by the family was the Hercules Iron Mine in northern Mexico, of which the collection contains many detailed maps. Some Ginther family members include: Aimee, Paul, Victor, Charles, George, and Henry. The Ginther brothers were born in Alsace-Lorraine. These papers belonged to Henry (or Henri) Ginther. After Henry's death in 1921, his wife Aimee and her family took possession of the collection.

Series Description or Arrangement

This collection consists of three boxes and is minimally processed. Box 1 primarily contains personal correspondence from Henry and Aimee Ginther, but also includes a bag of ore samples, a collection of keys, a Ginther family photograph album, and correspondence from Aimee Ginther's niece Kathy Fellows, who is the donor of these papers. Box 2 contains personal correspondence, financial records, maps of mines, and other materials. Box 3 contains items removed from Box 1, such as business cards, Mexican pesos, and a small metal tin.

Scope and Content Notes

The Ginther family papers date 1897 – 1999, bulk 1913 – 1924. Types of documents include maps of mines, financial documents, personal correspondence in both English and Spanish, government documents, newspaper clippings, and various other items such as ore samples. These papers help document the Ginthers' business dealings, mining operations, and personal lives during the early twentieth century.
