Biography

Eva Spencer Osterberg (January 31, 1921 – July 30, 2002) was a WAC (Women's Army Corp) during WWII and secretary to General S. L. A. Marshall. She was also a published writer and historian for the ETO (European Theater of Operations). Osterberg wrote about her experiences in Great Britain, France (Normandy), Switzerland, and Germany. She was a prolific writer and was published in several magazines. She received an award for her historical work by the United States and received a medal for her bravery. She passed away on July 30, 2002 at age 81.
