Biography

Willie Ray Parish, an artist and professor, was born in Mississippi and attended the University of Mississippi on a football scholarship. He graduated in 1970 with a BFA in sculpture. In 1978, Parish graduated with a MFA from the Otis Art Institute in Los Angeles. After graduation, he directed the Mississippi Museum of Art's Education Department and New South Film Center. In 1981, Parish moved to Muncie, Indiana and became an art professor at Ball State University. Three years later, he joined the faculty at the University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP). At UTEP, Parish ran the sculpture program and served twice as the chair of the Art Department. He also founded and directed the Border Art Residency program in La Union, New Mexico for 15 years. After teaching for 32 years at UTEP, he retired as a Professor Emeritus. Parish, along with his wife, artist Becky Hendrick, then moved to Tucson, Arizona and Puerto Peñasco, Sonora, Mexico. His artworks are found in the El Paso Museum of Art, the Mississippi Museum of Art, at UTEP, and in private collections.
