Niece of Dr. Stephen Thomas Turner, prominent El Paso physician, donor of residence to El Paso County Medical Society; born 1912, El Paso, Texas; daughter of trucking company proprietor.

Provides biographical sketch of Dr. and Mrs. Stephen Thomas Turner; recounts summers under care of Mrs. Turner after mother suffered disabling stroke; attending El Paso School for Girls; describes Turner home; recalls escapade of driving to Clint, Texas to deliver fruit and vegetables with Mrs. Turner; "Uncle Dockie's" purchase of farm in Clint, digging of lake, and founding of El Paso County's first Holstein dairy; visit of General John J. Pershing to Turner home; remarriage of Dr. Turner.
