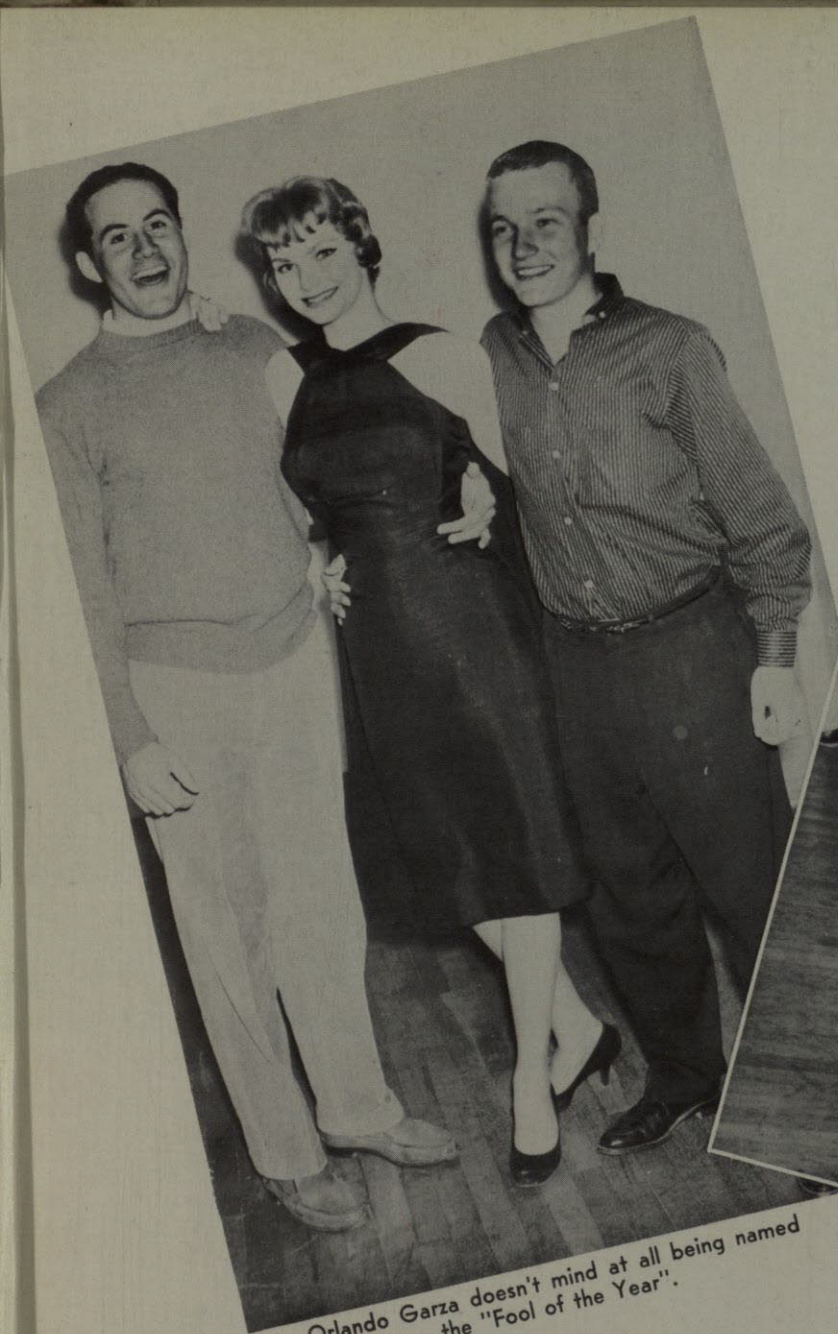

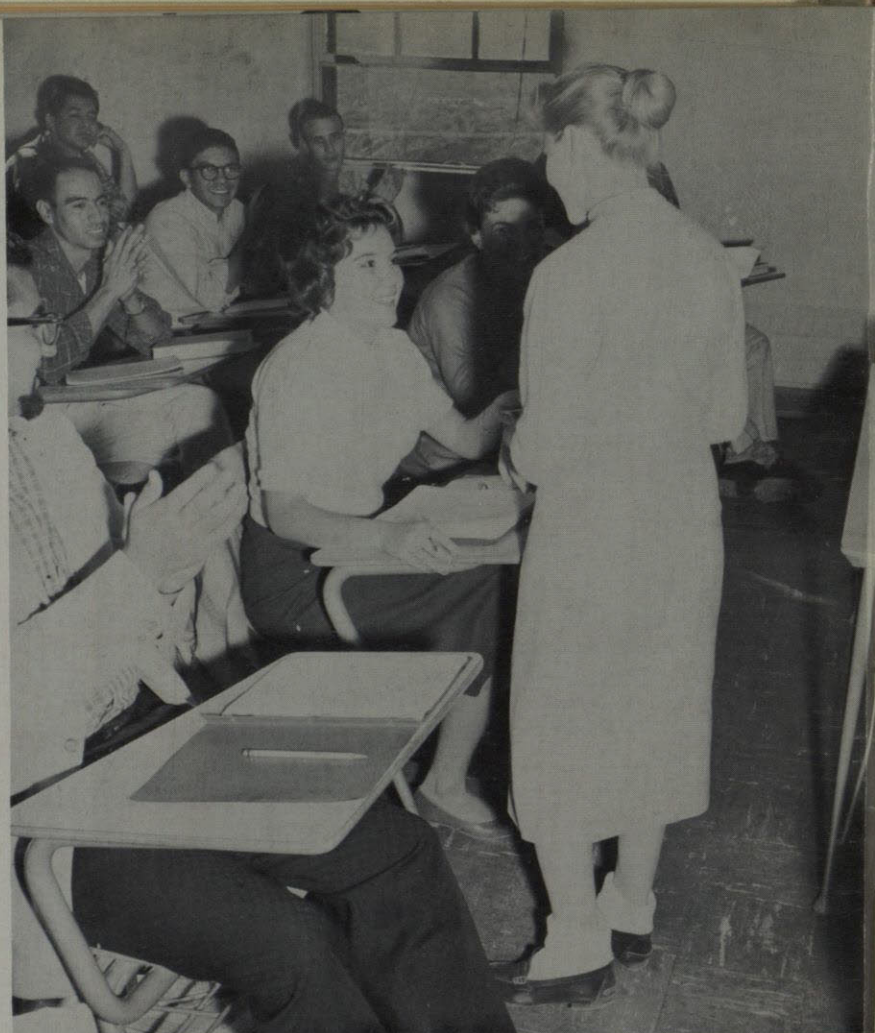

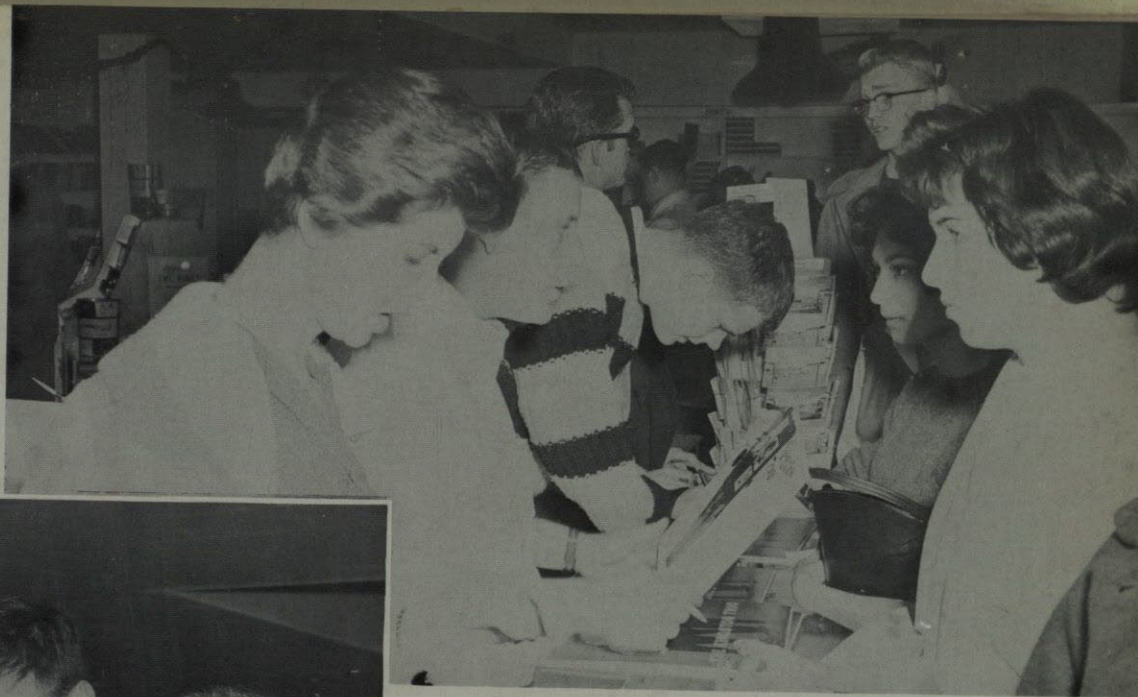

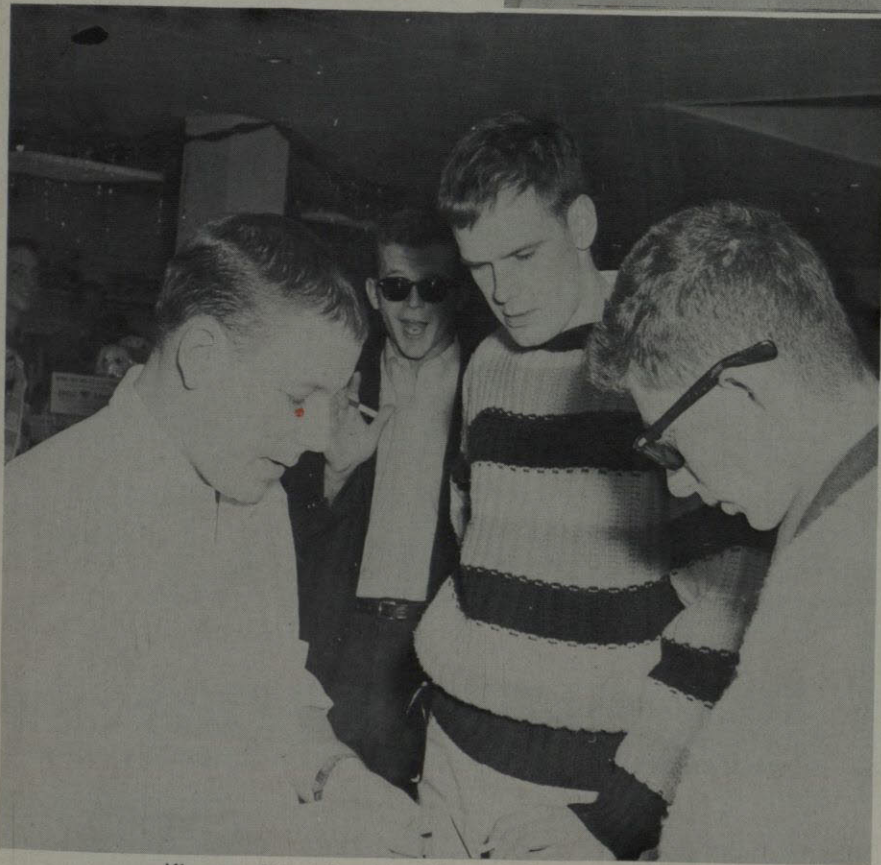

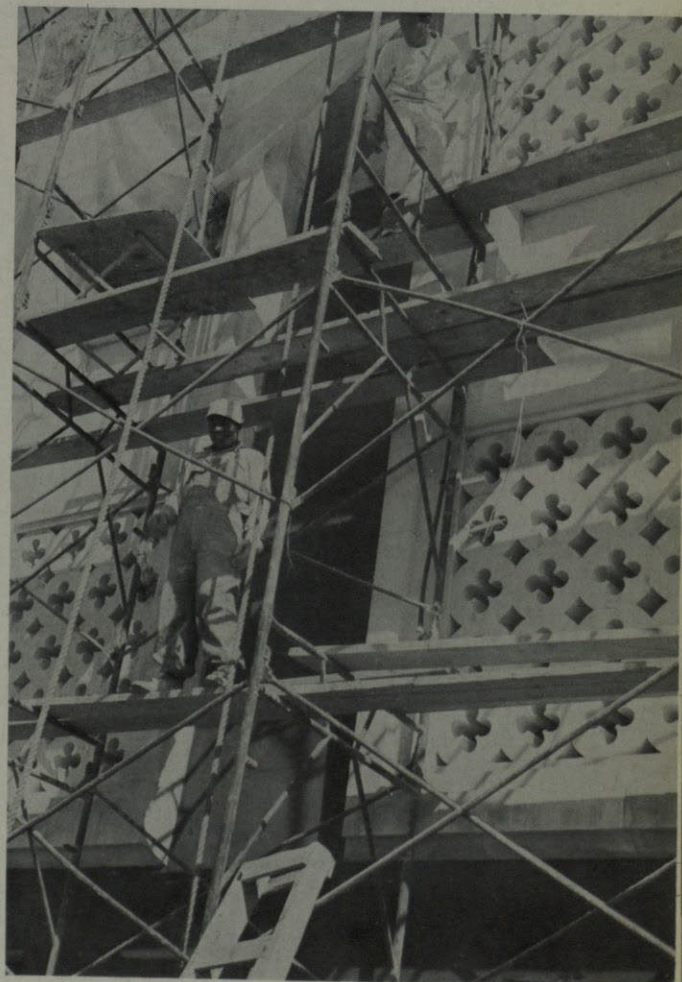

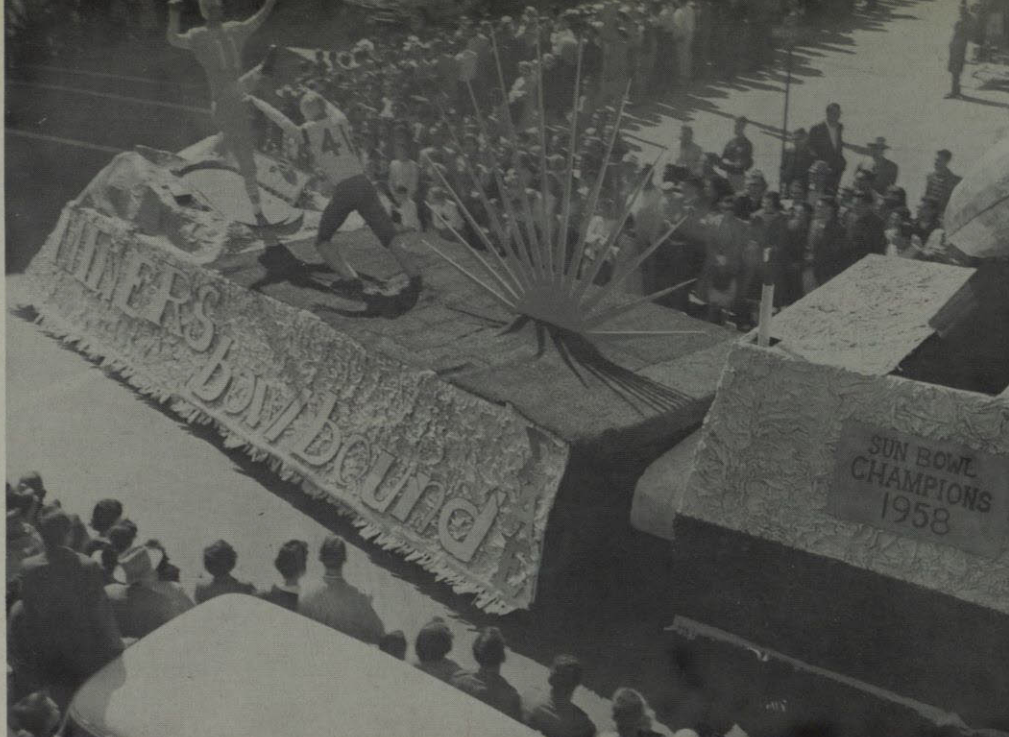
## homecoming . . . the "big" day

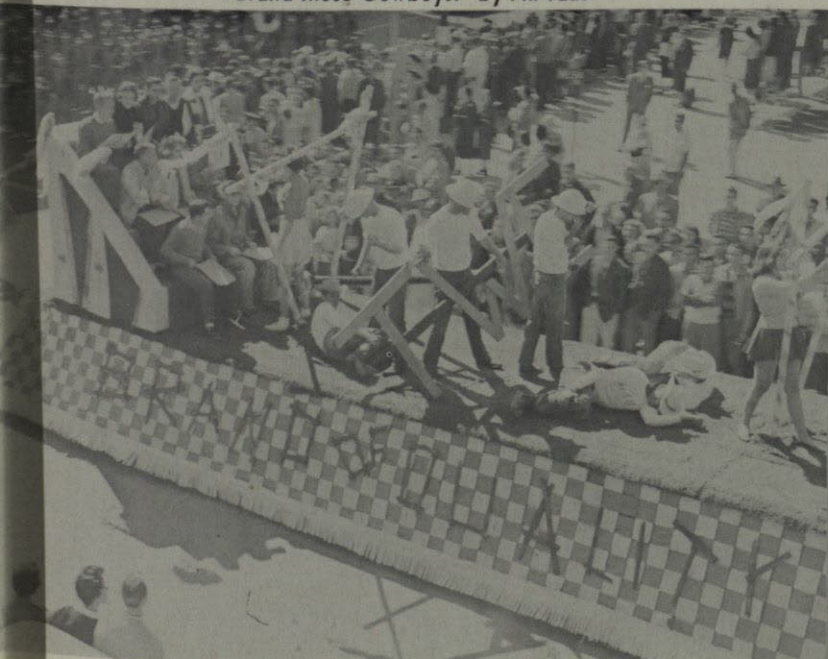
## the spirit of the college . . .

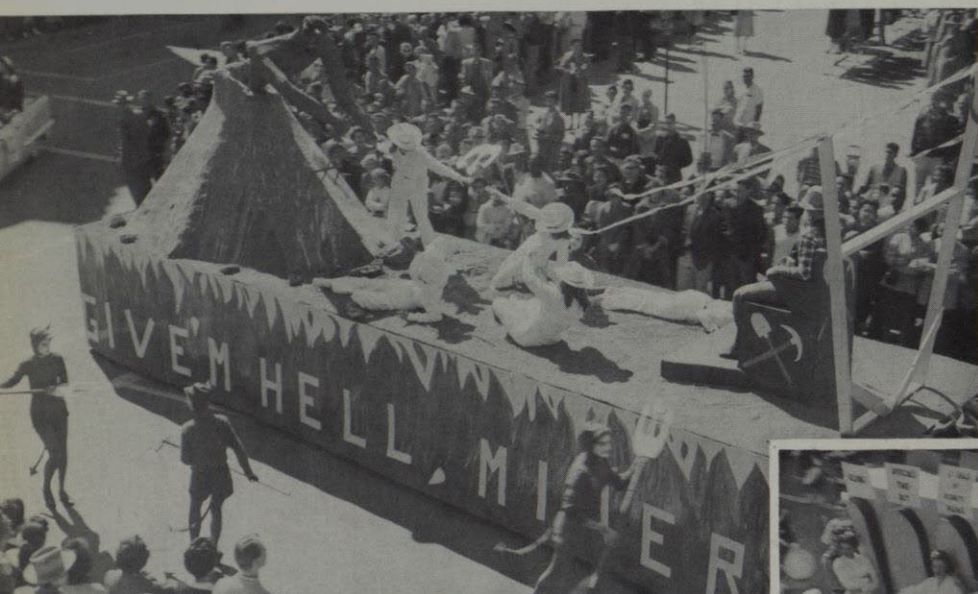

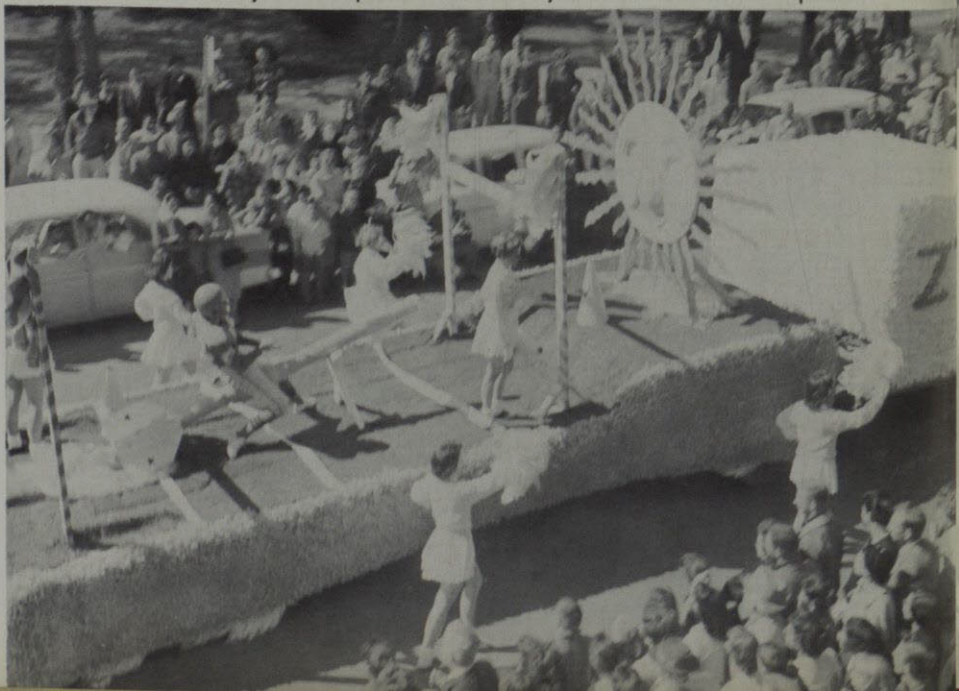

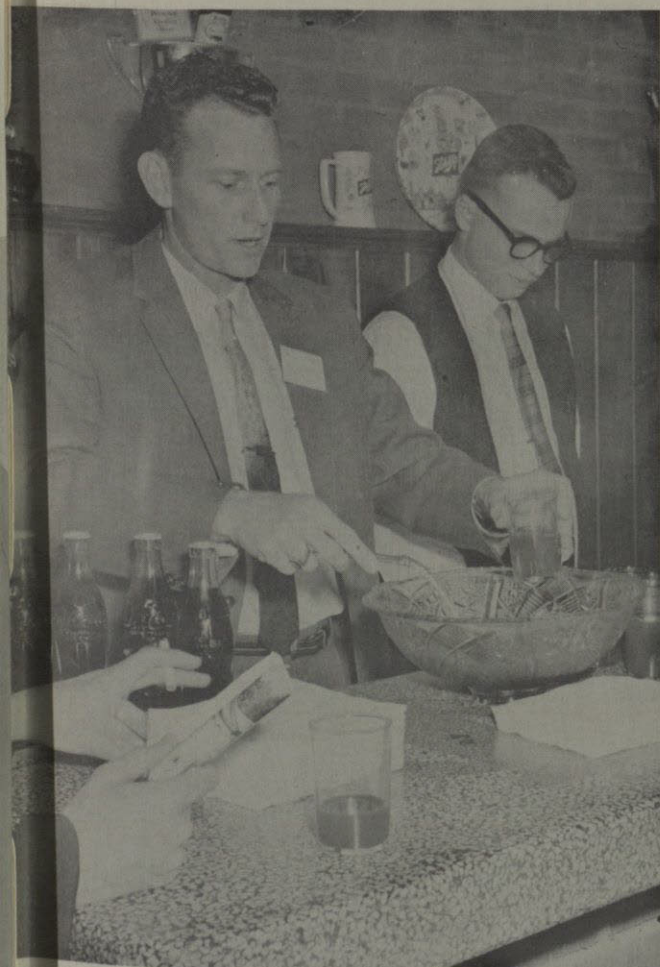
