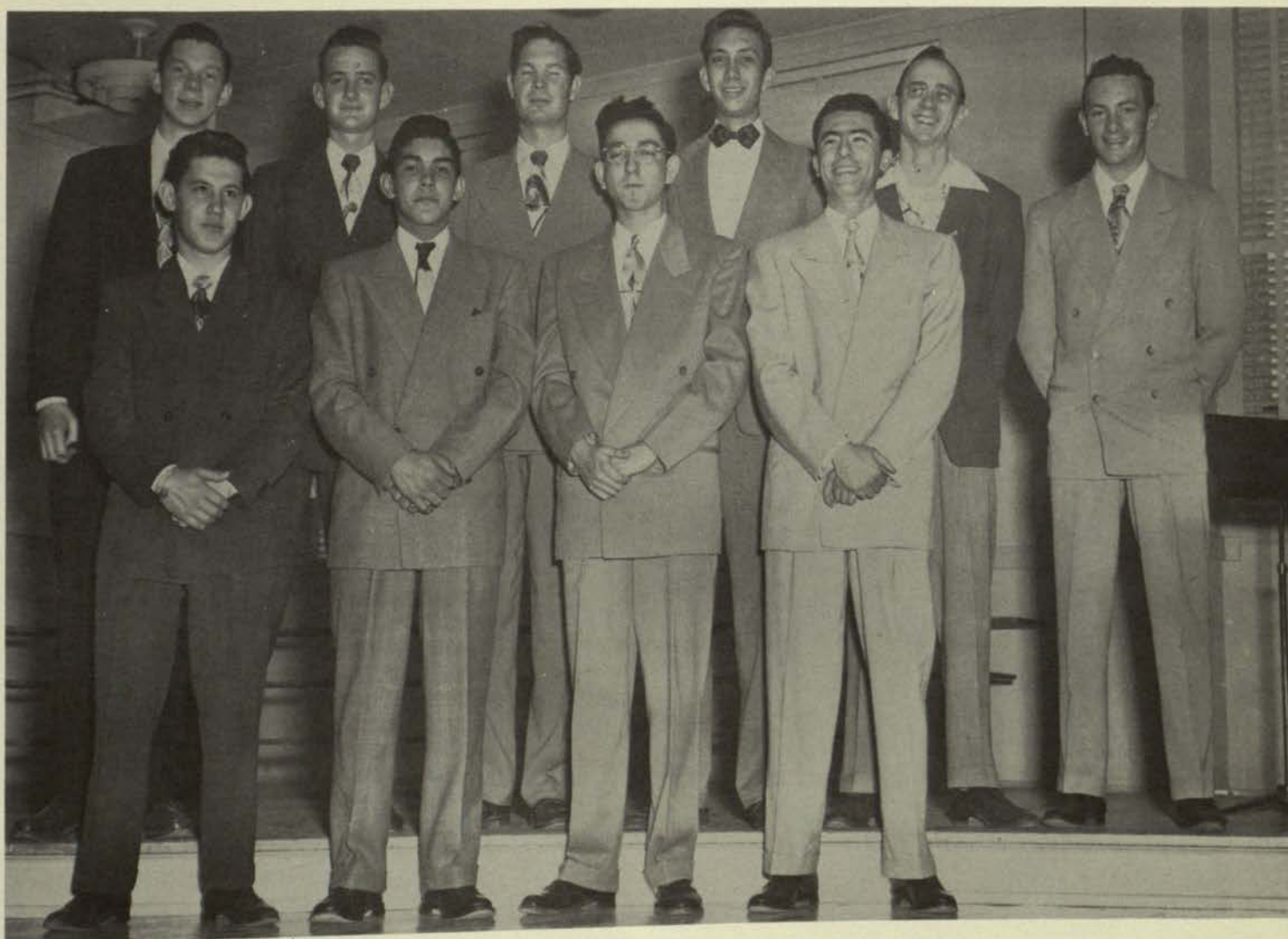

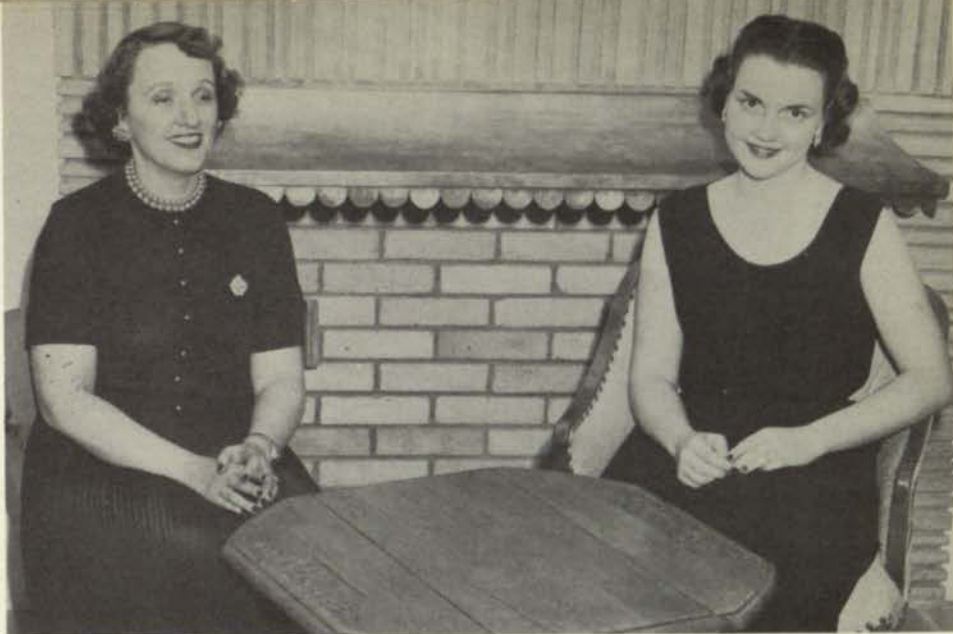
NEWMAN CLUB

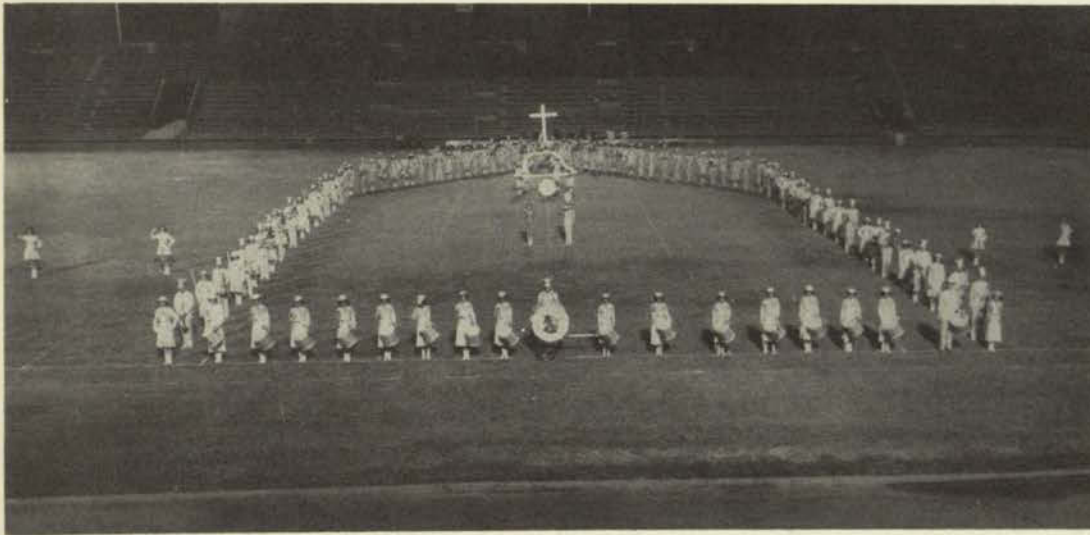

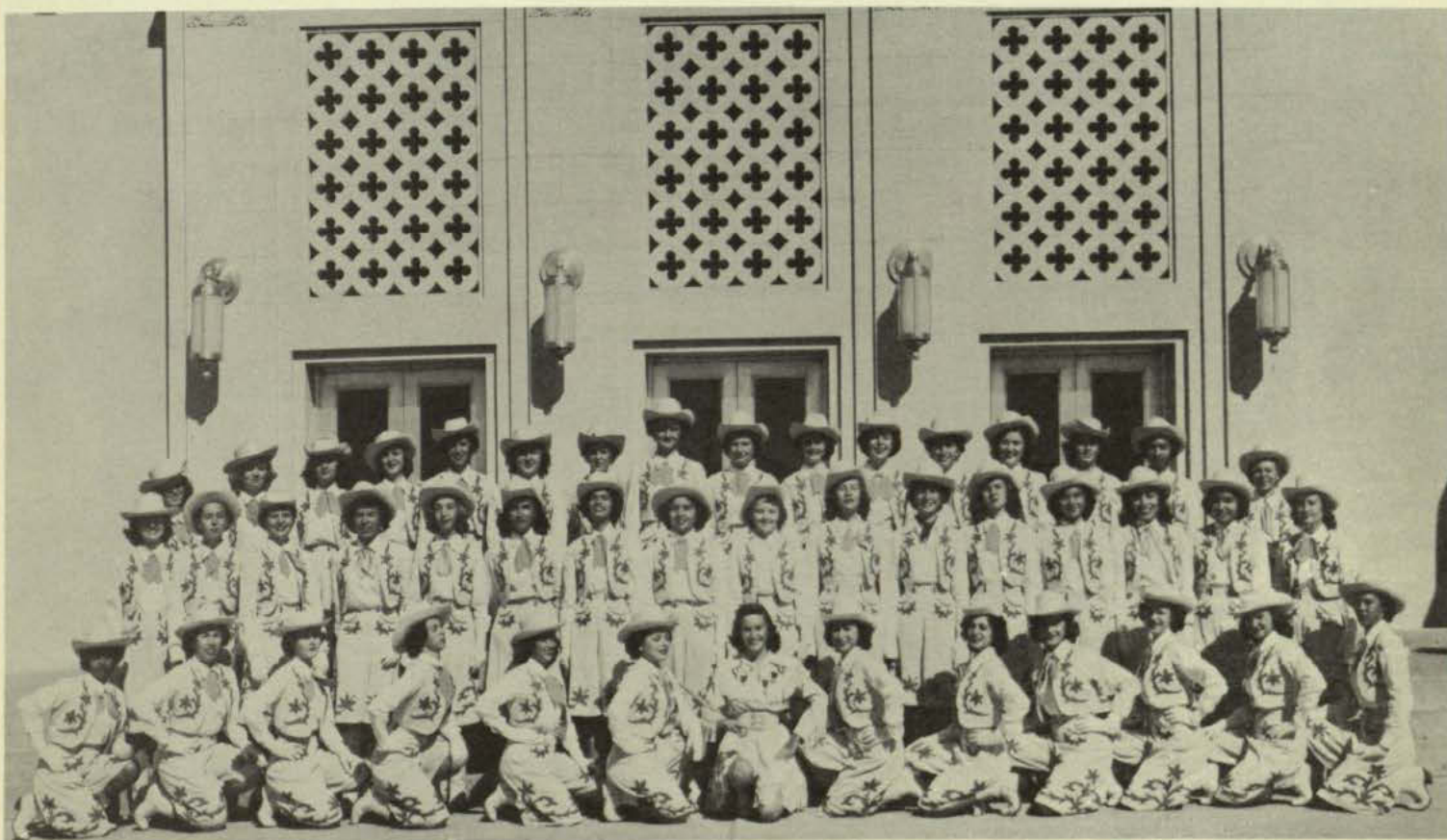

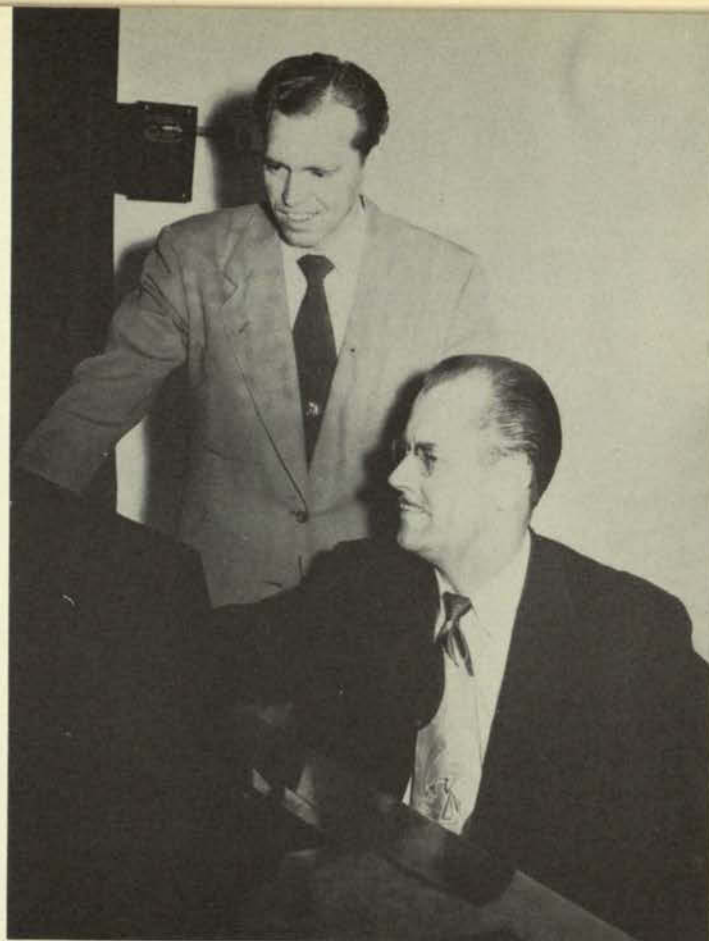
