The Interfraternity Council at Texas Western College is composed of the President and one voting representative from each of its member fraternities. Its officials are elected annually by a majority vote of the Council.

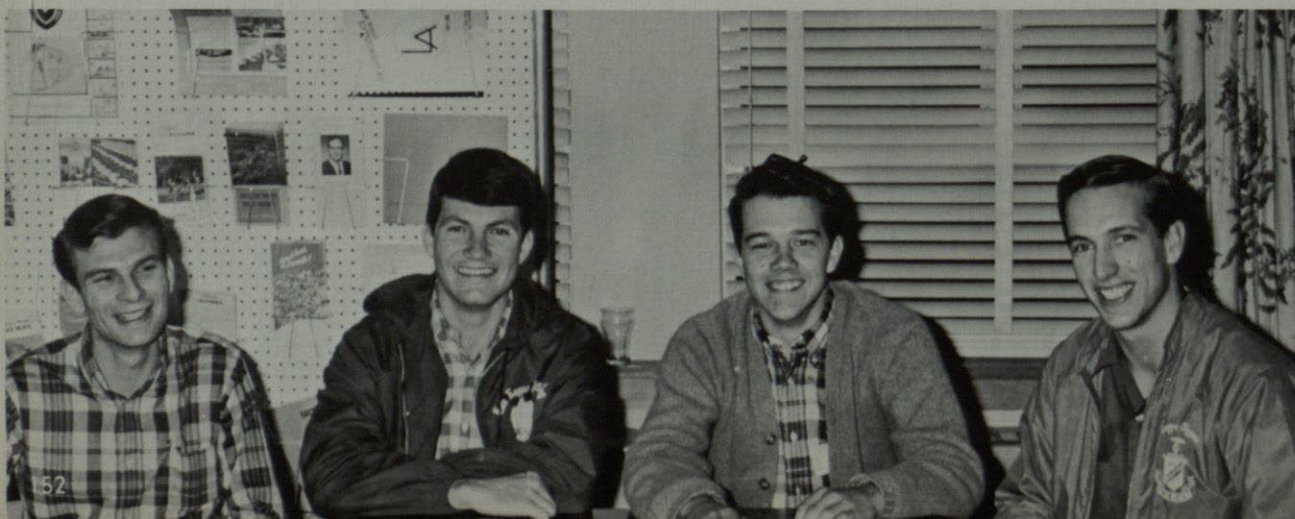

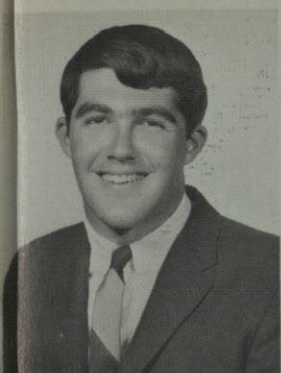
### TEKES HONORED AT THE JUAREZ RACE TRACK
