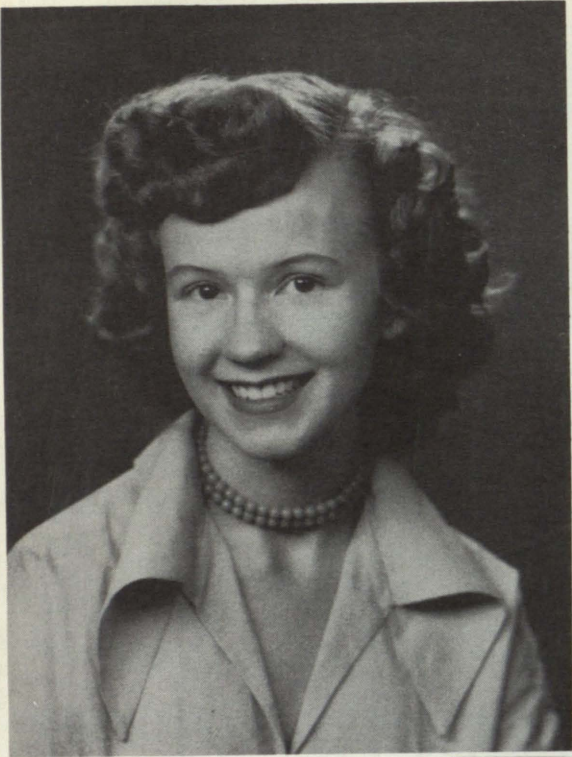
BAPTIST STUDENT UNION

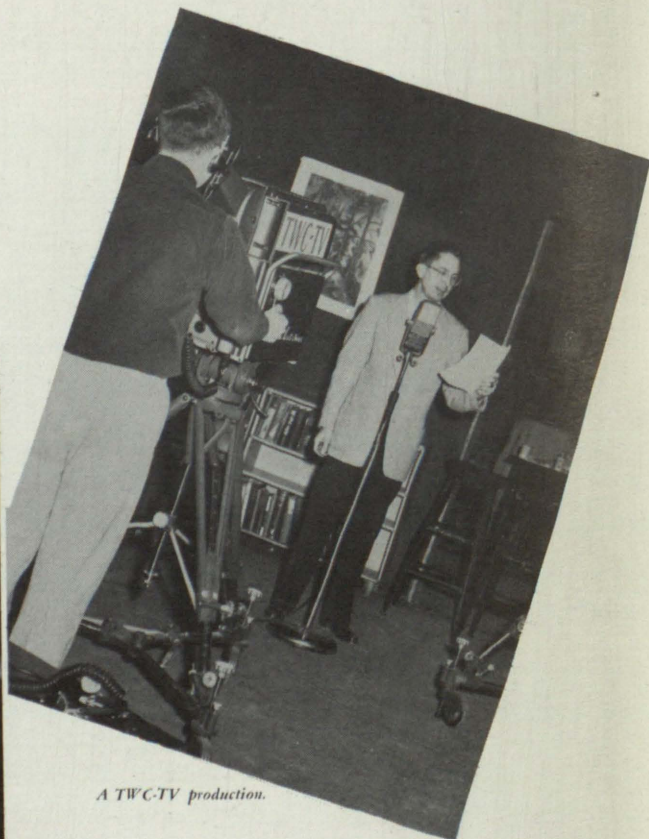

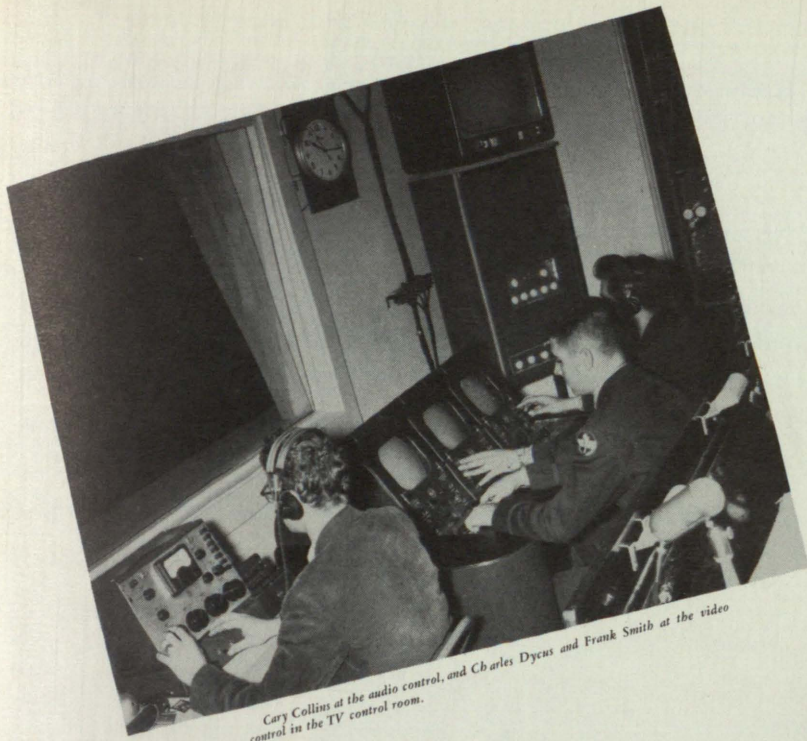

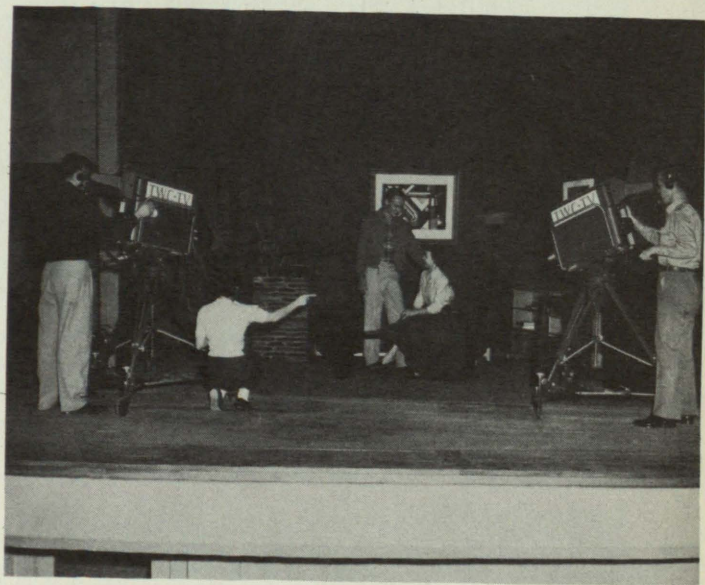

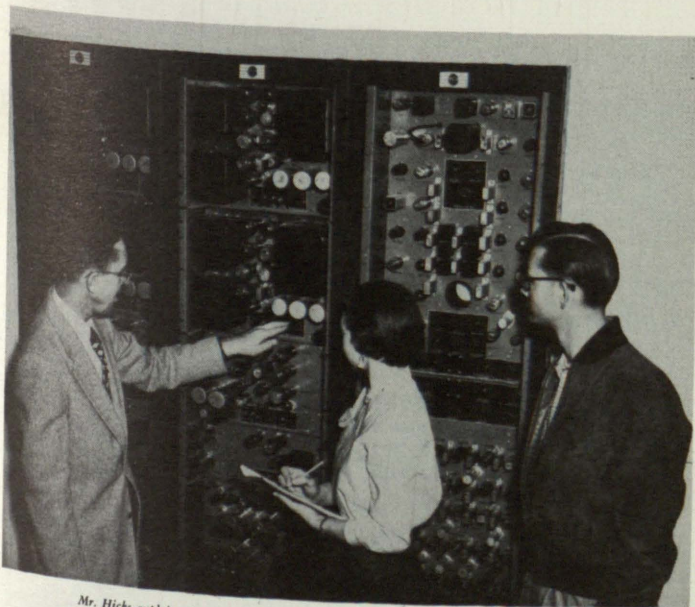
