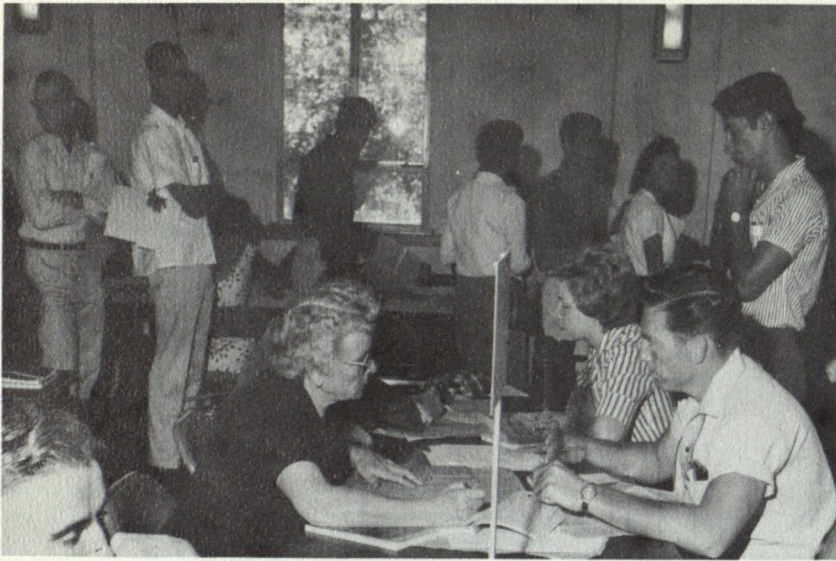
Every September the painting of the "M" on the mountain serves as orientation for freshmen and transfer students.

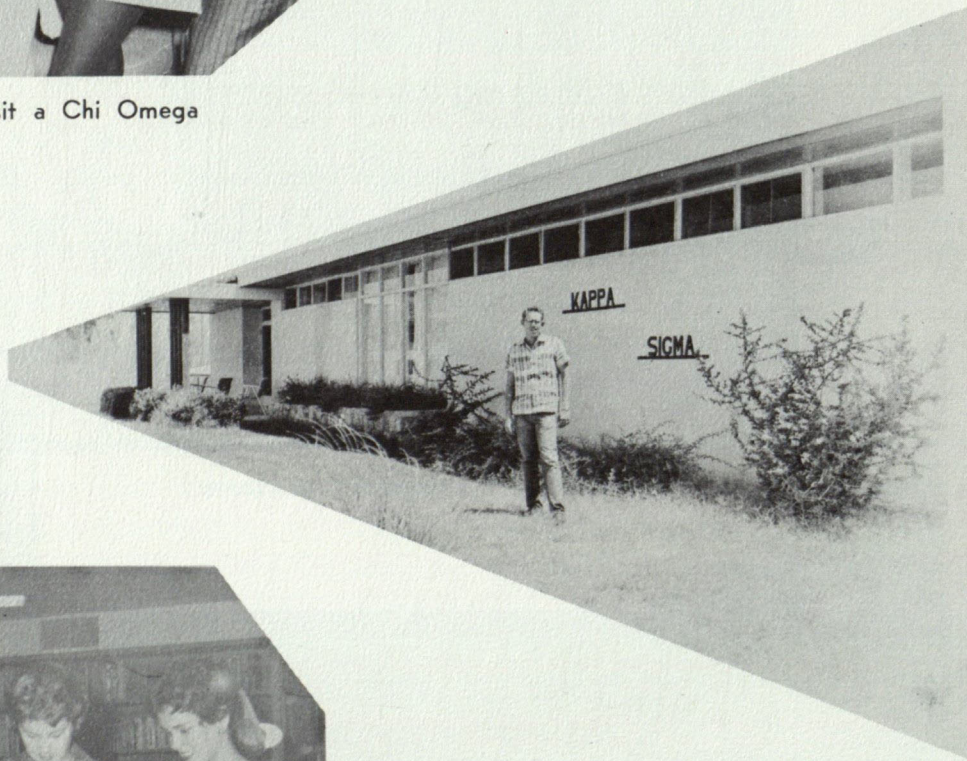

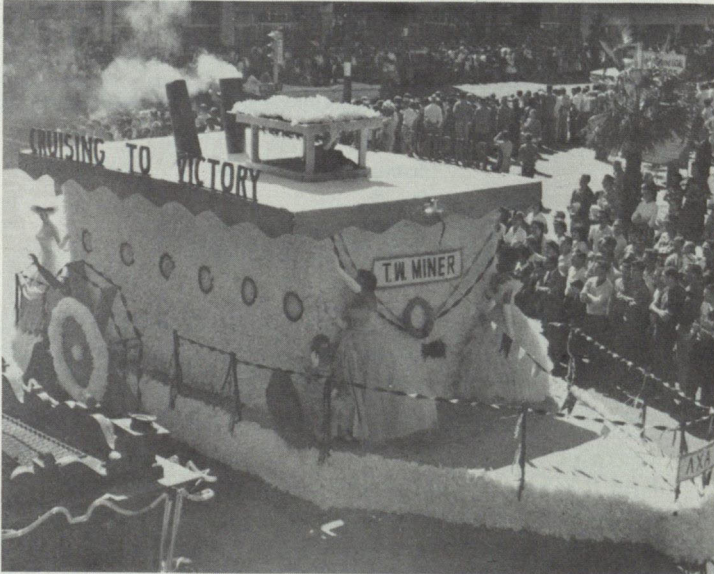

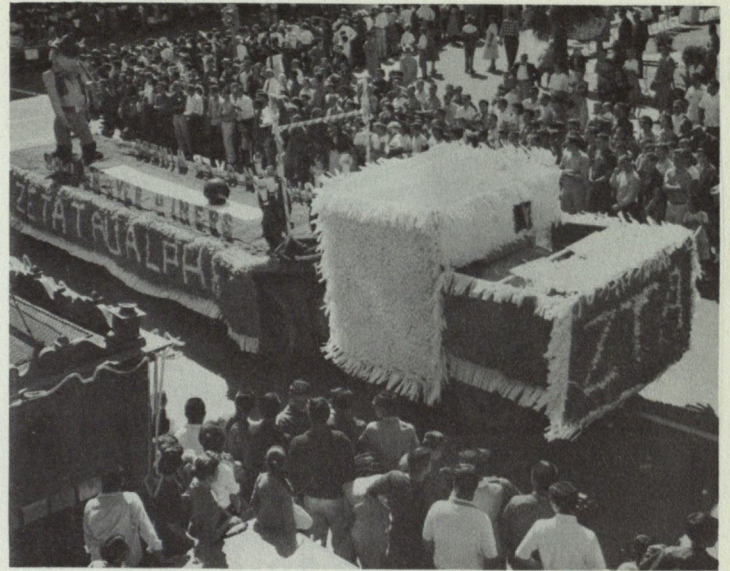

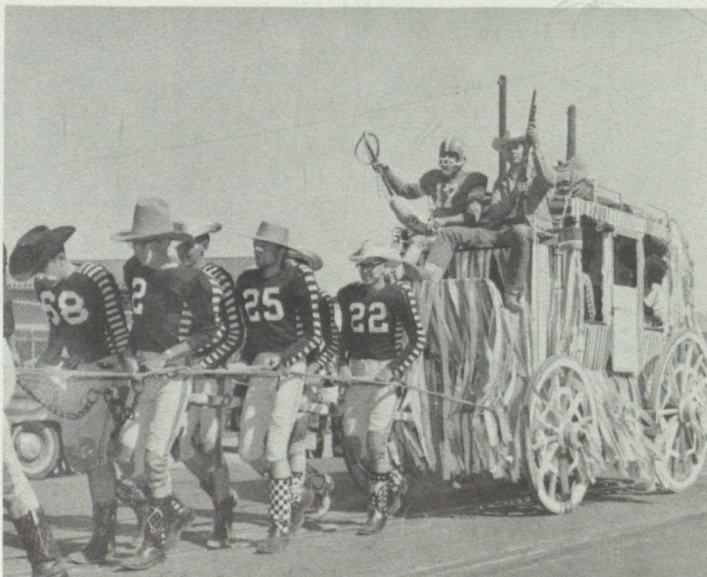

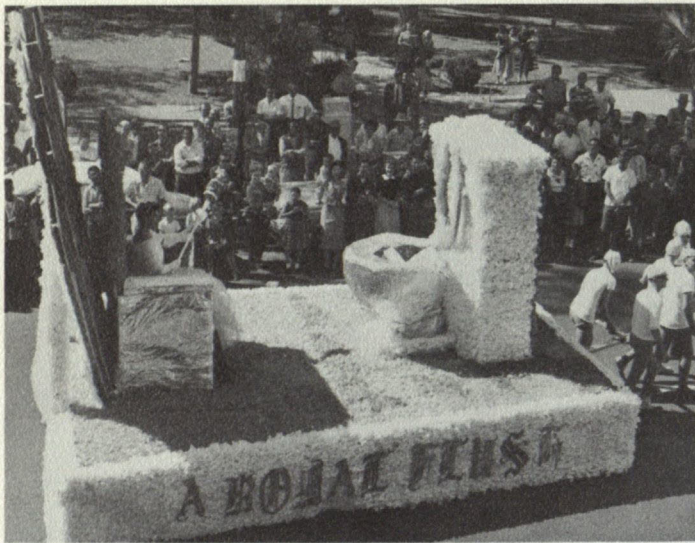


Zeta's giant Miner bowler brought the sorority second place.

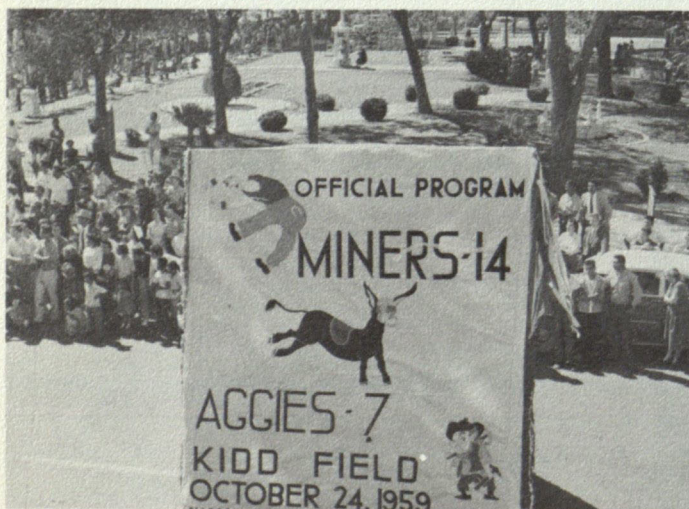

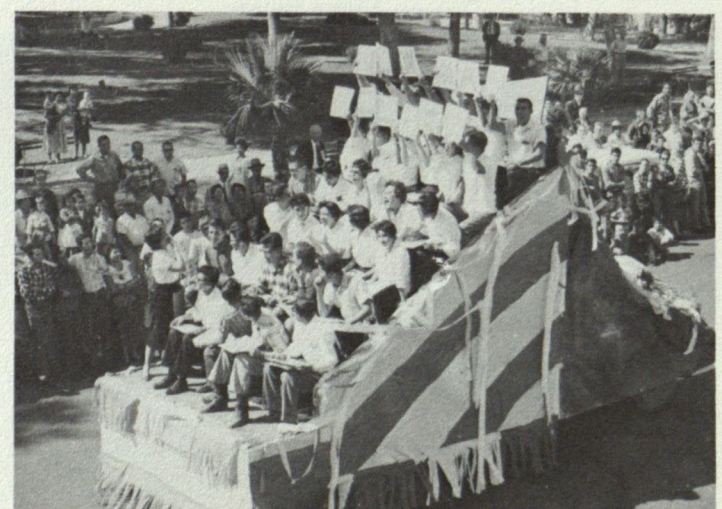

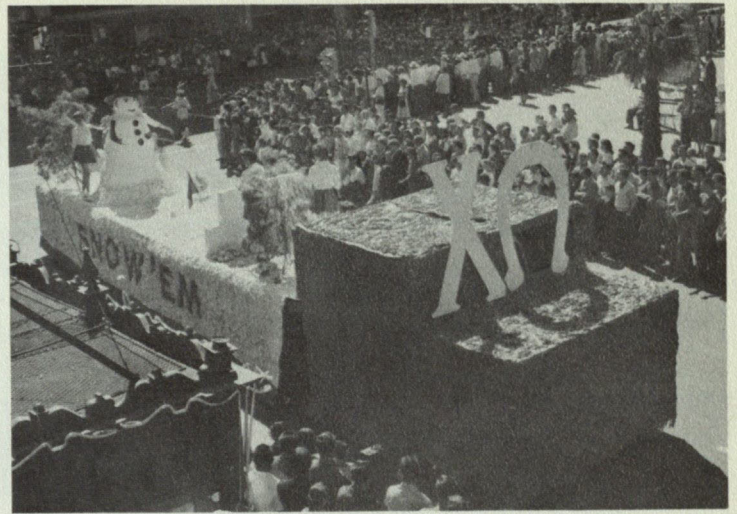
The Baptist Student Union predicted correctly but misjudged the score — TWC won 20-15.

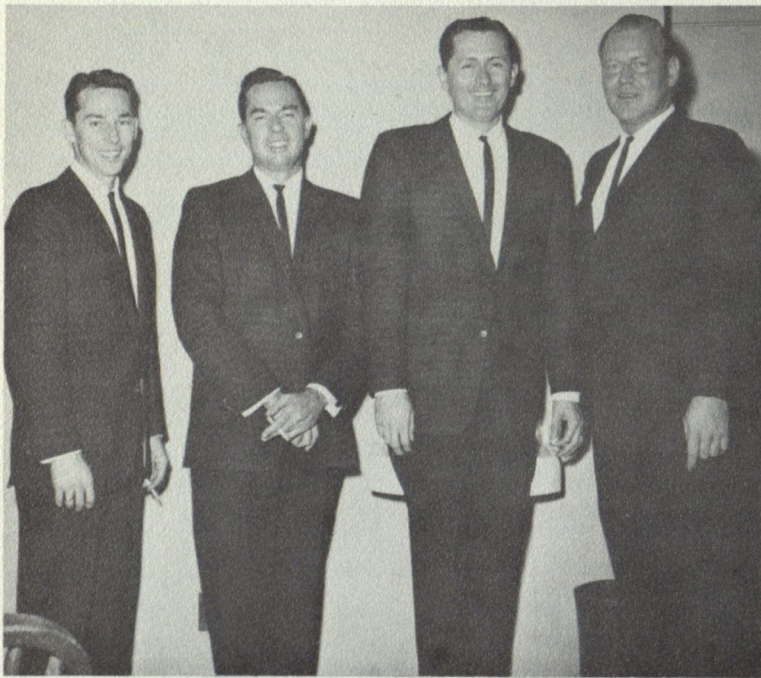

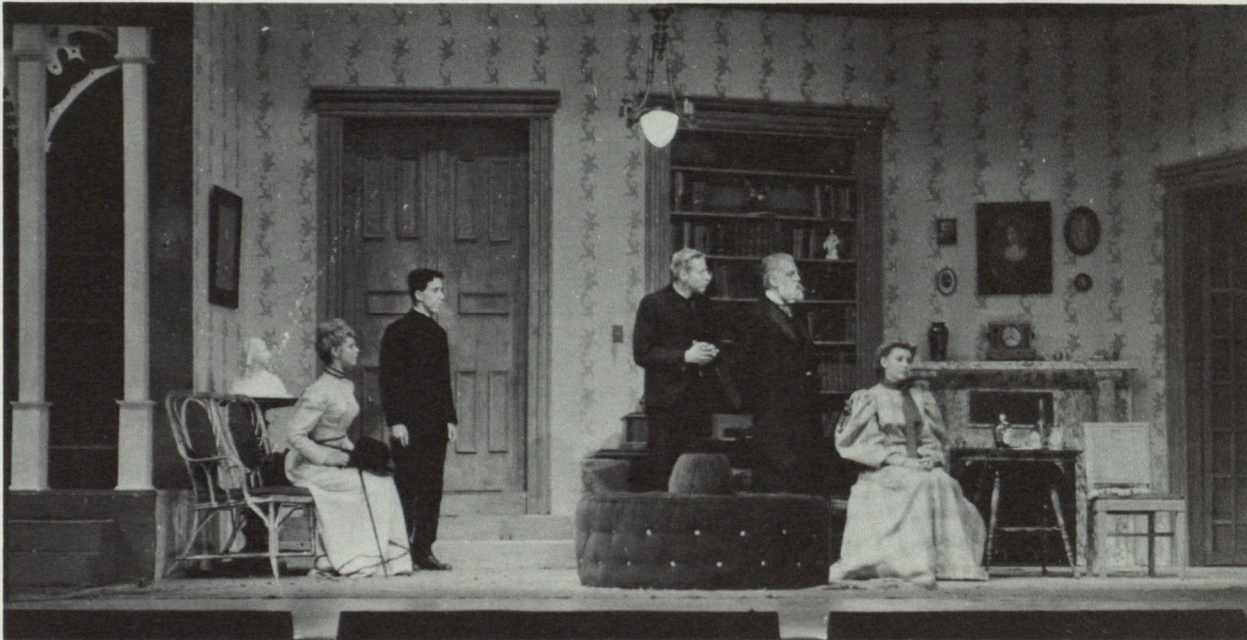
